



Health Hints by Anita Harrand RN, FCN,

(FNP-retired) August is National Breastfeeding Month

Psalm 120:5 "The Lord is your guardian; the Lord is your shade; he is beside you at your right hand. "

Breastfeeding is a personal decision and a decision on how to feed your infant should be made by the infant's mother and father and discussed with mom's health care provider. There is no right or wrong decision on how to feed an infant – breastfeeding vs bottle formula. New parents to be will have many questions about feeding a new infant. No one should pressure you about how to feed your infant. There should be no guilt if you don't breastfeed or are unable to do it. Try to start early in your pregnancy to ask questions about infant feeding options and talk to you Obstetrician about the pros and cons of infant feeding options. The intent of this article is to share information on breastfeeding.

What are the benefits of breastfeeding an infant (nih.gov)?

- 1. Breastmilk is essential nutrition for an infant.
- 2. Breastmilk can provide protection for the infant against common childhood infections and give the infant a better survival in baby's first year.
- 3. Early skin-to-skin contact and suckling may have physical and emotional benefits for baby.
- Breastmilk can reduce certain allergic diseases, asthma, obesity and type 2 diabetes in the baby.
- 6. Breastfeeding promotes a healthy weight for the baby.

Some studies show breastfeeding babies have better brain development.

What are benefits of breastfeeding for a mother?

- 1. Help mom lose weight.
- 2. Breastfeeding helps the mother's uterus contract and reduces blood loss after delivery.
- 3. Breastfeeding mothers have lower risk for depression.
- Breastfeeding mothers have lower risk for some diseases: breast & ovarian cancer, high blood pressure, arthritis, high blood fats, heart disease, and type 2 diabetes.

Please know that most health insurances should provide (at no cost) breastfeeding support, counseling and equipment (like a breast pump). Unfortunately there are some exceptions so talk to your medical insurance company.

So where do you get help and information about breastfeeding? Please talk to your Obstetrician/Midwife and Pediatrician about your questions and get a referral to a support group or a lactation specialist. The hospital you will deliver at should have a lactation specialist (breastfeeding specialist) on staff – ask for a referral.

The La Leche League (Illi.org) is a

nongovernmental, nonprofit organization that

advocates for breastfeeding, and provides education and training. In Michigan there are Facebook Support groups and breastfeeding leaders that are available. Try looking for them on Facebook, contact the

council@Illusa.org or email the Lake Orion leader at Lakeorion@yahoo.com (her meetings are the 1st and 3rd Monday at 10am on zoom). Remember every journey starts with the first step.
