FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

With the assistance of the campaign consultants from Bishop Thomas' office, Holy Trinity parish is entering into the first phase of the *Living Christ* Campaign. Our parish, along with nearly 40 other parishes are embarking on the third and final wave of this historic diocesan campaign. For the last year and half, Catholics from around our 19-county diocese have rallied around our bishop in support of his campaign case. Many of the parishes in the previous waves

exceeded their fundraising goals! These results have shown that Catholics have united from around the diocese to look beyond their own individual parish needs to the needs of our Bishop.

Our parish goal has been set at \$830,000. By the design of the *Living Christ* Campaign, Holy Trinity Parish will receive back 35% of this goal. If we exceed the goal, we will receive back 50% of the money collected over our goal. Our local case statement is to use these funds to eliminate our Holy Trinity School debt and renovate our Parish Center kitchen. Our first objective is to eliminate the debt. With the help of the money collected through *Living Christ* we will make our final payment to the school debt by June 2025. To meet this goal we will pay \$122,580.00 each year to principal and interest payments. Every dollar collected in these two years (June 2023- June 2025) will go to these payments. Our yearly operating budget will cover whatever shortfall we have in meeting that yearly payment.

After the debt is paid, the money collected in the final three years of the five-year pledge period will be deposited into a designated account for the Parish Center kitchen renovation. The renovation for the kitchen will not begin until the necessary funds are collected.

Under the leadership of the diocesan campaign representative, parish volunteers and I have begun meeting with parishioners to share the case for the campaign. I am happy to report that these few initial parishioner visits have gone very well. I have been inspired by our parishioners generous response. It is our hope to have the chance to visit with as many parishioners as possible to share this exciting and historic opportunity.


Our tithe for Sunday, February 19th, is Heartbeat of Northwest Ohio. Heartbeat is a life-affirming

The 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I Lv 19:1-2, 17-18

The LORD said to Moses, "Speak to the whole Israelite community and tell them: Be holy, for I, the LORD, your God, am holy. "You shall not bear hatred for your brother or sister in your heart. Though you may have to reprove your fellow citizen, do not incur sin because of him. Take no revenge and cherish no grudge against any of your people. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. I am the LORD."

Reading II 1 Cor 3:16-23

Brothers and sisters:

Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of God, which you are, is holy. Let no one deceive himself. If any one among you considers himself wise in this age, let him become a fool, so as to become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in the eyes of God, for it is written: God catches the wise in their own ruses, and again: The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are vain. So let no one boast about human beings, for everything belongs to you, Paul or Apollos or Cephas, or the world or life or death, or the present or the future: all belong to you, and you to Christ, and Christ to God.

Gospel Mt 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. "You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."
