

<u>A Nice Week in July</u>

Let me share with you several things that will be happening this week on a personal and public note. First the personal:

I will be gone this week from Monday, July 10 until Thursday, July 13. There will be no Masses Monday through Thursday, but there will be a morning Mass on Friday. I am heading to West Virginia and staying at Oglebay Resort attending the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology Priest Conference. A few hundred priests come from all over to hear Biblical presentations from several speakers including Scott Hahn. The theme for this year's conference is "Holiness." That is certainly a great topic for any priest. I attended one of these gatherings about five years ago and was very impressed with the talks and all the events that took place. Since the Toledo Priests Diocesan Conference is next summer, I decided to attend St. Paul Center Conference this year. Keep me in your prayers for a great week and I will certainly return the favor to you when I am gone.

I will return on Thursday, July 13, but with a fourhour drive, I did not feel comfortable scheduling a public Mass that day not knowing for certain that I could make it back here in time. July 13 is a big day in my family because it is my dad's birthday. This year he will celebrate his 81st birthday. He has the same birthday and is the same age as actor Harrison Ford. Therefore, if you can see the last Indiana Jones movie that is out in the theaters—you can think about my dad. You can also pray that my dad and Harrison Ford have a Happy Birthday!

Now some public happenings this week: We have several saints feast days this week. The first is Tuesday, July 11—St. Benedict who is known as the "Patriarch of Western Monasticism." He was famous for writing the monastic Rule that stressed obedience. He ended up founding twelve monasteries including Monte Casino.

The feast day for St. Kateri Tekakwitha is Friday, July 14. She was known as the Lily of the Mohawks. Despite abuse from her fellow tribesmen for becoming Catholic, she remained true to her newfound faith. She died at the very young age of 24, but was known for great pious practices such as waiting outside church in the cold and the snow for the church to open so she could receive the Eucharist at Mass.

The feast day of St. Bonaventure is Saturday, July 15. He was both a Bishop and Doctor of the Church. He wrote many philosophical and theological works including "Journey of the Soul to God", "Tree of Life" and "The Life of St. Francis." His role as pastor and teacher inspired many people in the Catholic faith.

You may have other things that you will be celebrating this week and I hope all goes well for you1

Eucharistic Miracle of Morne-Rouge, Caribbean Island of Martinique, 1902

On May 8, 1902, Ascension Day, the Mount Pelée volcano started erupting lava and ashes. The inhabitants of Morne-Rouge, strongly devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, immediately hurried to their parish church to ask Our Lady of Deliverance to spare their village from catastrophe.

At that moment of sudden danger, people rushed to the confessionals. The parish priest, Fr. Mary, gave a general absolution to all the faithful, distributed Holy Communion, and then exposed the Blessed Sacrament for public adoration. At a certain point, a woman cried out, "The Sacred Heart of Jesus is in the Host !" A large number of people witnessed the apparition of Jesus in the Host, showing His Sacred Heart crowned with thorns. Some declared they also saw the Precious Blood of Jesus dripping from His Sacred Heart. The vision lasted several hours and stopped only after the reposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. On May 8th, the village of Morne-Rouge was spared from the volcano's devastating fury. Therefore, the local population had a chance to reconcile themselves with God, receive the sacraments, and so be prepared to die in the state of grace.

On August 30th of the same year, a violent eruption of the same volcano destroyed also the village of Morne-Rouge.


CHOIR?
