

Don't Grieve, Just Give

"Today is holy to the LORD your God. Do not lament, do not weep!" — for all the people were weeping as they heard the words of the law.

He continued: 'Go, eat rich foods, and drink sweet drinks, and **allot portions to those who had nothing prepared**; for today is holy to our LORD. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the LORD is your strength!"' (Nehemiah 8:9-10)



Every Sunday during Lent, all priests, religious, and consecrated people in the Catholic faith pray this passage from Nehemiah during their Morning Prayer.

These are the words spoken by Ezra to the People of Israel after they had just listened to the Book of the law of God, many for the first time. They realized after hearing, that they had not been doing so well in keeping the law.

Lent is a yearly opportunity to relook at our lives. If we are honest, we will find habits that have crept in and are keeping us from following the LORD as closely as we truly could.

Yet, Ezra reminds the people that when God corrects us, this is a very good thing, not something to weep about. Contrition is good, but correction is better. As much as we should be sorrowful for our sins, we should be even more thankful that God has found us worth his effort. There is an old saying, "God loves us right where we are...but he loves us too much to leave us there."

Note that **allotting portions for others in need** is part of the reboot. Almsgiving is key to Lenten discipline. Focusing on the need of another and acting on that need is very helpful to the self. Lent is not a time to mope, it's a time to rejoice that God cares about us and then make others rejoice because God (and we) care about them.

May God bless us this Lent and always, *Fr. John*



Tim's Clinic/ Hope International: Calendar of Giving Suggestions

Sunday: The cost to provide medical attention to a child is \$5.00. Consider a \$2.50 gift to help.

Monday: Providing a gynecological exam for a young mother at the clinic costs \$10.00. A \$5.00 donation would cover half this cost!

Tuesday: A month's supply of asthma medication for a child under 5 years old is \$15.00. Could you cover 20% of this cost and add \$3.00 to your gift to help?

Wednesday: The cost of providing a child with anti-parasitic medication for three months is only \$3.00. Please consider donating \$3.00 to cover this cost.

Thursday: Medications to control fever, pain and a month's supply of vitamins for a child at Tim's Clinic is \$5.00. Can you pay half of this cost and add \$2.50 to your gift?

Friday: The cost of providing a sonogram for a pregnant mother is \$15.00. Please consider adding one-fifth this cost to your gift - \$3.00.

Saturday: A month's supply of asthma medication for a child over 5 years old is \$30.00.

A \$3.00 contribution to your gift would be a big help!

Operation Outreach Spotlight: Tim's Clinic/Hope Clinic International

Tim's Clinic: Hope Clinic International, founded in 1997, established Tim's Clinic in Nicaragua in 2005 in response to poverty, lack of medical resources, and an overwhelming need of children and young mothers.
Our full-time clinic serves children's and women's health in Estelí, Nicaragua, where 48% of the population lives in poverty.

Dedicated in 2005 in memory of Ann Arbor native Tim Anderberg, Tim's Clinic provides free medical care and free medications for children and young mothers. Hope Clinic International also supports



the Nicaraguan medical staff at Tim's Clinic: more than 8,000 medical visits were provided last year for children and young mothers whose families live on less than \$2 a day. During the pandemic, our clinic has continued to faithfully serve the poor.



Wayuu Medical Missions:

In March 2020, Hope Clinic International held our first medical mission trip to serve the Wayuu people in the region of La Guajira, Colombia. Only 4% of the Wayuu people have access to clean water, which has led to an

alarming high rate of child mortality and malnutrition. During Covid-19, we were able to raise funds to purchase food baskets for the families, and this upcoming June, we will be partnering with Colombian doctors for another medical mission trip to serve this impoverished community.

Hope Clinic International will continue with our efforts to provide hope by promoting health to those communities that are in dire need of medical services. Through Tim's Clinic and our Medical Mission Trips, we continue to serve God's children! On behalf of all we serve, we thank you for your prayers and support!



discernment process of coming to know one's Vocation in life.



be good husbands & fathers.




