
## St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church

# An Important Message From The Michigan Catholic Conference

#### **Stop the Abortion Amendment!**


A petition drive (**Reproductive Freedom for All**) has started, sponsored by Planned Parenthood and the ACLU, to get a constitutional amendment for an unlimited right to abortion on the November ballot.

This amendment would repeal dozens of state laws, including our state's ban on tax-funded abortions, the partial-birth abortion ban, and fundamentally alter the parent-child relationship by preventing parents from having input on their children's health. The petition drive is also an attempt to invalidate the state's long-standing ban on abortion, which is poised to become effective again, if or when the U.S. Supreme Court overturns Roe v. Wade.

Now, more than ever, **your help is needed** to stand up for the unborn and speak up for the dignity of human life at all stages. This amendment is opposed by the Michigan Catholic Conference, the official voice of the Catholic Church in Michigan on public policy.

Help spread the word about why people should NOT sign the Reproductive Freedom for All Petition.

Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat for Catholics ages 14+. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. A person is permitted to eat one full meal, or two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Fasting is obligatory for Catholics age 18-59, unless they are pregnant, nursing or have other medical needs.

Fr. John and some parish dads will host all interested high school aged young men in going through the


discernment process of coming to know one's Vocation in life.




## Church Library Highlight: Holy Thursday

"On the night before His death, His betrayer already at work, our Lord lifted a simple chalice in a world covered in darkness. Elevating it, He sealed for eternity a new covenant between God and man, imparting to us the gift of His Body and Blood.

In these sublime meditations on the events of Holy Thursday, Nobel laureate François Mauriac reminds us of the ineffable value of the gift given us that evening in the Upper Room: the Eucharist, present still in the tabernacles of the world ...where Christ waits patiently for us to visit Him, pray with Him, and receive fullness of life from Him.

To read these stirring pages is to rejoice again in the fact that Christ has not left us orphans. He remains with us at all times in the Eucharist, without which we can never attain true peace. As Mauriac notes, No man knows himself, if he has not looked at his soul in the light of the Host lifted above the ciborium.



Come, then, into the heart of this mystery of our Faith. Take your seat at the table beside our Lord. Learn why millions of souls believe that Christ is physically present in their local church, and discover the joy they experience when they meet Him there. You, too, can have the strength, the hope, and the consolation Christ gives to all who place themselves beside Him."



These ideas are typical costs, during typical times. In light of the recent typhoon, however, these samples do not capture the current price gouging.

**Sunday:** (15) 100lb sacks of rice - a one-month supply, costs \$770. Consider supporting 0.01% by donating \$7.70.




# Guided Holy Hours \_\_\_ During Lent
