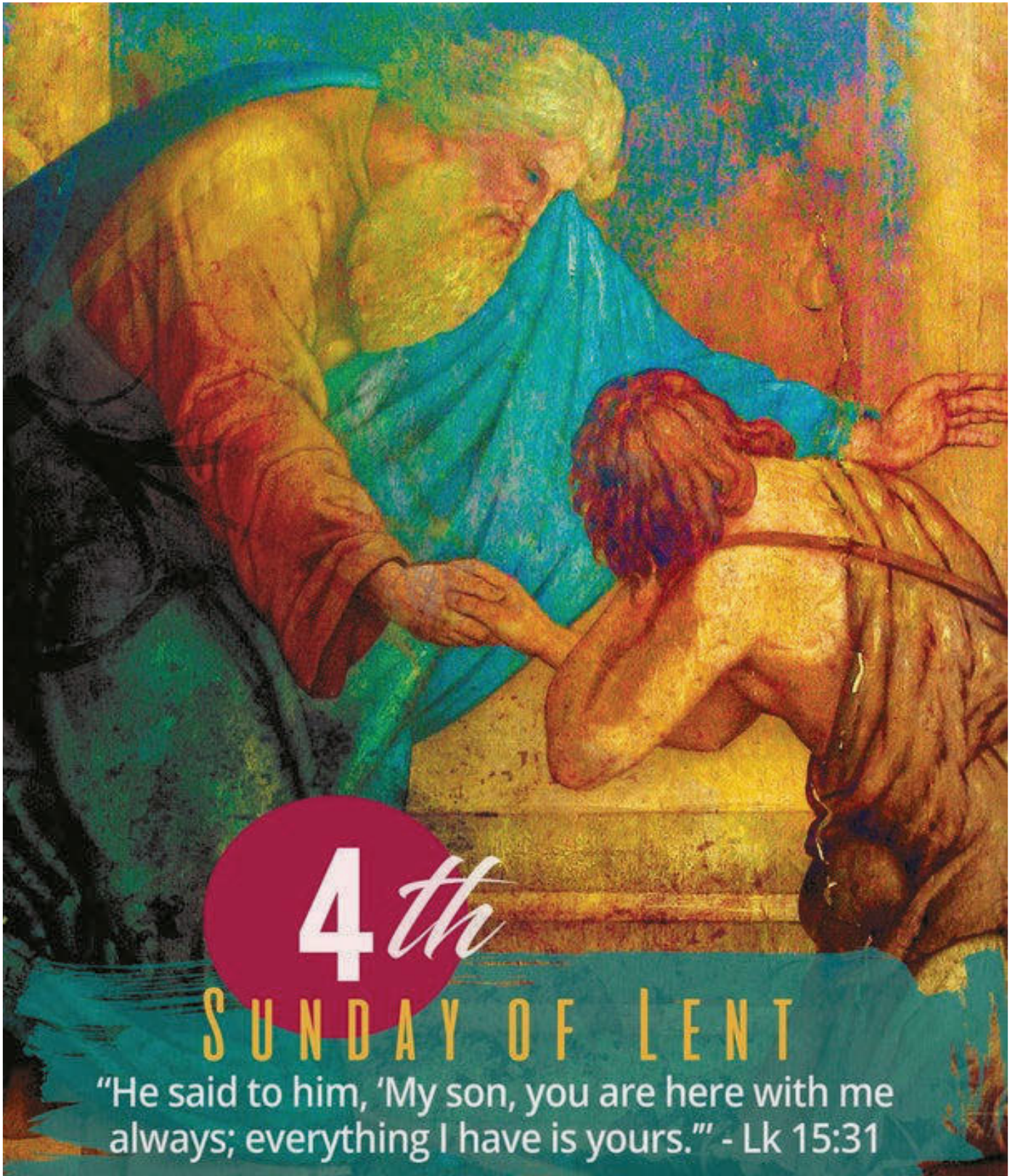

A Note From Fr. John: Manna From Heaven

In our first reading this week, from the book of Joshua, we hear about how the manna that God had given to the Israelites in the desert comes to an end upon their entrance into the promised land. Of course, we know that this is a type, or an image, of the Eucharist being the food that strengthens us for our journey on earth until we enter the true promised land – Heaven!



Jesus promised to be with us until the end of time. Now, we know that he is in all things as all things were created in and through him. But we also know that he became truly incarnate, he became a human being to show us the value that God puts on our bodily experience as human beings.

Jesus walked and talked, healed, and died in a human body which is essential to the human nature that he assumed. He could have done everything spiritually while remaining in heaven, but he didn't. He came in the flesh and did everything to save us in the flesh.

Therefore we, as Catholic Christians, also come to the Lord in the flesh every Sunday as a family. We, too, have an incarnate human nature. If God didn't do a roundabout, but chose to show us the value of our nature by taking it on in every respect, then shouldn't we make a similar effort in coming to him in the same nature that he shared with us?

I invite all of you who have not yet returned to Mass in the fullness of your human incarnate nature to consider coming back now. If you are truly unable by an incapacity or an extraordinary fear of Covid, that is acceptable as a reason to not come. But, for those who are not in those categories, watching the Mass on livestream is not equal to coming to Mass in the flesh. It does not fulfill the obligation to respond fully to Jesus. Livestream is meant to meet the needs of those who absolutely cannot come.

The incarnate, bodily presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is not equal to a spiritual presence. Jesus went out of his way to honor our nature by coming to us in it and then feeding us with his perfect incarnate nature: body, soul, and divinity.

We are not yet in heaven, and even when we prayerfully get there, we will still long for our bodies to fully experience the presence of God, which will happen only after the second coming of Christ.

Let us, while we now have a chance, make every effort to experience Jesus in our bodies and souls. Please consider fully participating in the true Manna from Heaven if you haven't done so during the pandemic.

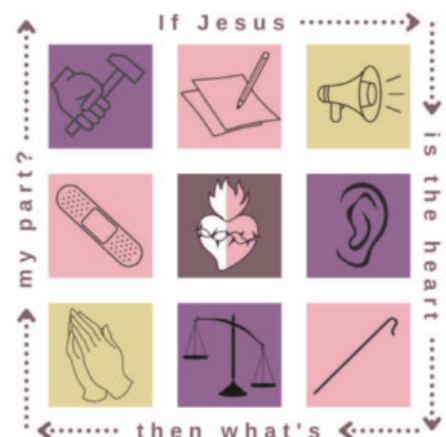

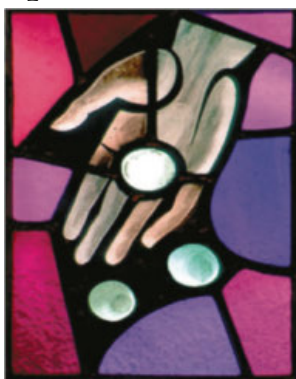


Operation Outreach

Calendar of Giving for St. Mary's School & Child Rescue Center

Sunday: Annual tuition for a high school student is \$600. Provide 1% = \$6.00 to help.

Monday: Socks & underwear for a rescued child is \$2.50. Can you provide that?

Tuesday: The cost of food each day is \$1.00 per child. Consider adding this today.

Wednesday: The total cost for a rescued child from the streets is \$350. Consider donating 1% = \$3.50 toward this.

Thursday: Toiletries cost \$3.00. Provide these essentials by adding \$3.00 to your gift.

Friday: A pair of sneakers is \$15. Add \$1.50 to help support.

Saturday: The total cost per boarding student is \$3.00 per day. Considering adding this to your gift.

Operation Outreach Spotlight: St. Mary's School & Child Rescue Center

Join us to transform Street Kids to College Graduates.

In the central Highlands of Kenya about 100 miles from Nairobi stands St. Mary's High School & Child Rescue Center, quite possibly the most effective & efficient charitable endeavor in Africa!

St. Mary's serves young people, from ages 3 to 21.

The High School is ranked in the top 1% of all high schools in Kenya.

691 children are served annually, 87% live on campus

95% of graduates from the high school receive college scholarships.



The Child Rescue Center

One of the secrets of the great success of the St. Mary's Program is housing both the Child Rescue Center as well as the Boys High School on the same 8 acre school grounds. There is great mentorship of the younger boys by the high school students. The high school students have "Little Brothers" for whom they want to be positive role models. The younger boys have "Big Brothers" who help steer them on the right path toward academic success and a strong moral compass.



The High School

With 467 students, St. Mary's High School is designed to serve poor and working class young people. St. Mary's is not a typical school but one that is committed to offering a quality education by instilling a character-building work-ethic that produces a young man who is a role model to the young children in the Child Rescue Center. Caring for the livestock on the school farm is one of the many programs at St. Mary's that extends beyond the rigorous academic curriculum and provides self-discipline for all students as well as some of the daily food for the children.

The school motto is: "You give us the Boy, We give you the Man."



Guided Holy Hours During Lent

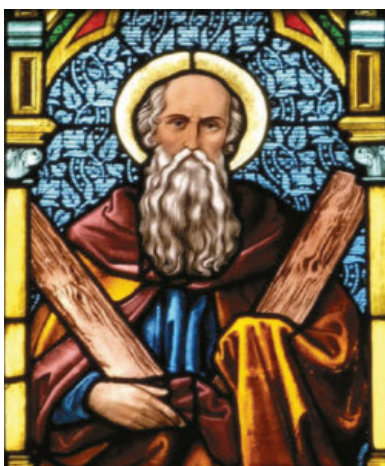
