### The Gift of Mercy for Me to Give

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As you can see, in this week's note from the Worship Commission, we will begin the **Divine Mercy Novena** together on Good Friday and end it on the Feast of Divine Mercy, which is the Second Sunday of Easter, April 24. This is a beautiful prayer and a gift from heaven. God often asked St. Faustina to pray directly for this soul or that; most often for a soul of someone preparing for death or a soul of someone who had already passed and was still being purified.



The nine-day novena of prayers that we will be praying together offers nine different categories of souls that she was asked to pray for, including those who are striving to live a holy life. One of my favorite lines that the Lord is reported to have said to St. Faustina is: "those who need my mercy most, deserve it most!"

This is not our general understanding of the application of mercy. We can tend to think that mercy is deserved by earning it thorough a faith-filled life. That is not what seems to be indicated by the Lord. It is just to figure that those who need mercy more abundantly would be those who have sinned more abundantly. And strict justice would declare that they be less entitled it. So, is God an enabler?

No, but he employs sinners who already know his mercy (though, again, without ever having earned it) to then turn around and implore it on behalf of others who have yet to know it. So, he wants us to be the enablers! There is much complained about regarding the prospect of God condemning people for their sins. Yet too little is said about us condemning sinners for their sins. We do it all the time in our anger and resentment (you can forgive them God, but not me!).

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is about me begging God not to condemn anyone, especially the worst sinners! So, let me stop complaining about God being rightly just, and start doing more praying for God to be mercifully forgiving.

So, it seems that mercy is in fact deserved by a faith-filled life! Yes indeed, through my faith-filled prayers, it is *deserved* by others.

#### The Divine Mercy Novena

The Worship Commission would like to invite all parishioners to pray The Divine Mercy Novena starting on Good Friday and ending on the Sunday following Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday. This Novena was given to St. Faustina by Our Lord in 1931. The nine days between the Feast of the Ascension and Pentecost, when the disciples would meet in the upper room to pray, is often considered to be the first novena.

What is a Novena? A novena (meaning nine) refers to **nine days of prayer,** asking God for a specific intention, through a Saint's intercession. Most novenas begin or end on a Saint's feast day. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited by using a rosary. Novenas are a beautiful way to develop a meaningful prayer life.

Our Lord said to St. Faustina: Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you. Pick up a pamphlet in the Narthex and join your fellow parishioners in praying this wonderful devotion to Our Lord, Jesus Christ.



### An Important Message From Bishop Boyea

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It appears there will be many petitions circulating in these coming months to put a number of items on the ballot this fall. Most of these can rightfully be left to the prudent decision of our Michigan electorate. In fact, the Michigan Catholic Conference is encouraging us to sign the two petitions for Let MI Kids Learn, dealing with scholarships and tax credits for those with children in non-public schools.

However, recently, Planned Parenthood, the ACLU and other organizations have begun seeking signatures for a petition to put a much more serious matter on our state ballot this fall. They seek to enshrine within our State Constitution a right to an abortion for the totality of the term of pregnancy. Please do not sign this petition. This is a radical proposal. They do not like the fact that, should the U.S. Supreme Court strike down Roe v. Wade, each state in the United States would then be governed by whatever laws are on their books regarding abortion. Here in Michigan that law bans abortion.

So, to sign such a petition is actively to cooperate in the promotion of this great evil of abortion, something Pope Francis has labeled as murder. Sisters and brothers, please do not sign any petitions that would legalize abortion. To do so is to place oneself in danger of grave or mortal sin because of this active and direct cooperation with evil.

In addition, please pray for those who seek abortion as the answer to their situation in life. Also, let us all provide for healthy and safe alternatives to assist those who currently see no way out. Let us always opt for life and help others to be able to do the same.




#### Our Prayer to St. Andrew
