
St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church

The Divine Mercy Novena

The Worship Commission would like to invite all parishioners to pray The Divine Mercy Novena starting on Good Friday and ending on the Sunday following Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday.

This Novena was given to St. Faustina by Our Lord in 1931. The nine days between the Feast of the Ascension and Pentecost, when the disciples would meet in the upper room to pray, is often considered to be the first novena.

What is a Novena? A novena (meaning nine) refers to **nine days of prayer,** asking God for a specific intention, through a Saint's intercession. Most novenas begin or end on a Saint's feast day. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited by using a rosary. Novenas are a beautiful way to develop a meaningful prayer life.

Our Lord said to St. Faustina: Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you. Pick up a pamphlet in the Narthex and join your fellow parishioners in praying this wonderful devotion to Our Lord, Jesus Christ.



A Note From Father John

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

St. John Paul II, who was pope from 1978-2005 (I had to add that for the young ones around here) was well known for repeating one simple phrase: "Be not afraid."



These words in fact, were the first uttered by him to the public in St. Peter's square right after he became pope. He reflected on these words in a book entitled, *Crossing the Threshold of Hope*:

In a certain sense it was an exhortation addressed to all people, an exhortation to conquer fear in the present world situation ... Why should we have no fear? Because man has been redeemed by God. When pronouncing these words in St. Peter's Square, I already knew that my first encyclical and my entire papacy would be tied to the truth of the Redemption. In the Redemption we find the most profound basis for the words "Be not afraid!": "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" (cf. In 3:16).

St. John Paul II had grown up in the late 1930's in Nazi occupied Poland and then Soviet (Russian) occupied Poland for another 30 years after that! He saw terrible things that are not unlike some of the terrors that we are seeing again today in the world, particularly in Ukraine, which borders Poland.

Yet, arguably, there has been no person in the history of the world that offered more hope than did JPII, that is, of course, except for Jesus. This happened even though he saw and suffered horrible things. How? Because he saw the big picture.

That is what Easter is meant to help us see, the big picture. Jesus has come to redeem us and was successful in his work. Of course, we must be open to his work for it to have any effect in our lives and that is what happens when we put our faith in Him. Faith is the *opposite* of fear.

May this Easter day of celebration be an occasion for us to ponder the big picture. We are not going to save this world and we are not going to save our lives in it. That is not what Jesus came to do. We need to care for the world and ourselves but not worry when faced with insurmountable things that render ultimate earthly salvation unobtainable.

Ultimate salvation was already obtained through the redemptive work of Christ, but not for this world. Jesus has risen and now awaits the day that he will take us to himself. What is there to fear if I have faith in that? Our work is not primarily to save the planet or save ourselves on it; it is to tell everyone the truth about the One who has already saved all things and awaits to show us.

Happy Easter everyone! He has Risen, He has risen indeed!

We are looking to fill a specific void in our usher schedule and create a team (3+ people) who would usher at the Sunday 5:30pm Masses in February, June & October.



An Important Message From Bishop Boyea

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It appears there will be many petitions circulating in these coming months to put a number of items on the ballot this fall. Most of these can rightfully be left to the prudent decision of our Michigan electorate. In fact, the Michigan Catholic Conference is encouraging us to sign the two petitions for Let MI Kids Learn, dealing with scholarships and tax credits for those with children in non-public schools.

However, recently, Planned Parenthood, the ACLU and other organizations have begun seeking signatures for a petition to put a much more serious matter on our state ballot this fall. They seek to enshrine within our State Constitution a right to an abortion for the totality of the term of pregnancy. Please do not sign this petition. This is a radical proposal. They do not like the fact that, should the U.S. Supreme Court strike down Roe v. Wade, each state in the United States would then be governed by whatever laws are on their books regarding abortion. Here in Michigan that law bans abortion.

So, to sign such a petition is actively to cooperate in the promotion of this great evil of abortion, something Pope Francis has labeled as murder. Sisters and brothers, please do not sign any petitions that would legalize abortion. To do so is to place oneself in danger of grave or mortal sin because of this active and direct cooperation with evil.

In addition, please pray for those who seek abortion as the answer to their situation in life. Also, let us all provide for healthy and safe alternatives to assist those who currently see no way out. Let us always opt for life and help others to be able to do the same.


Grief Ministry Meeting


Our Prayer to St. Andrew



It was Tuesday, June 2, 2015 at our home in Detroit, Jim, my husband, tripped on a crack in the driveway, and fell. He looked up at me and said, "I can't move." In the fall, he had broken his neck and was paralyzed! He was taken to Oakwood Hospital in Dearborn and had surgery. After being there a week, still paralyzed and in a neck brace, the doctor came into the room and said he was ready to be released, but he couldn't go home. 
