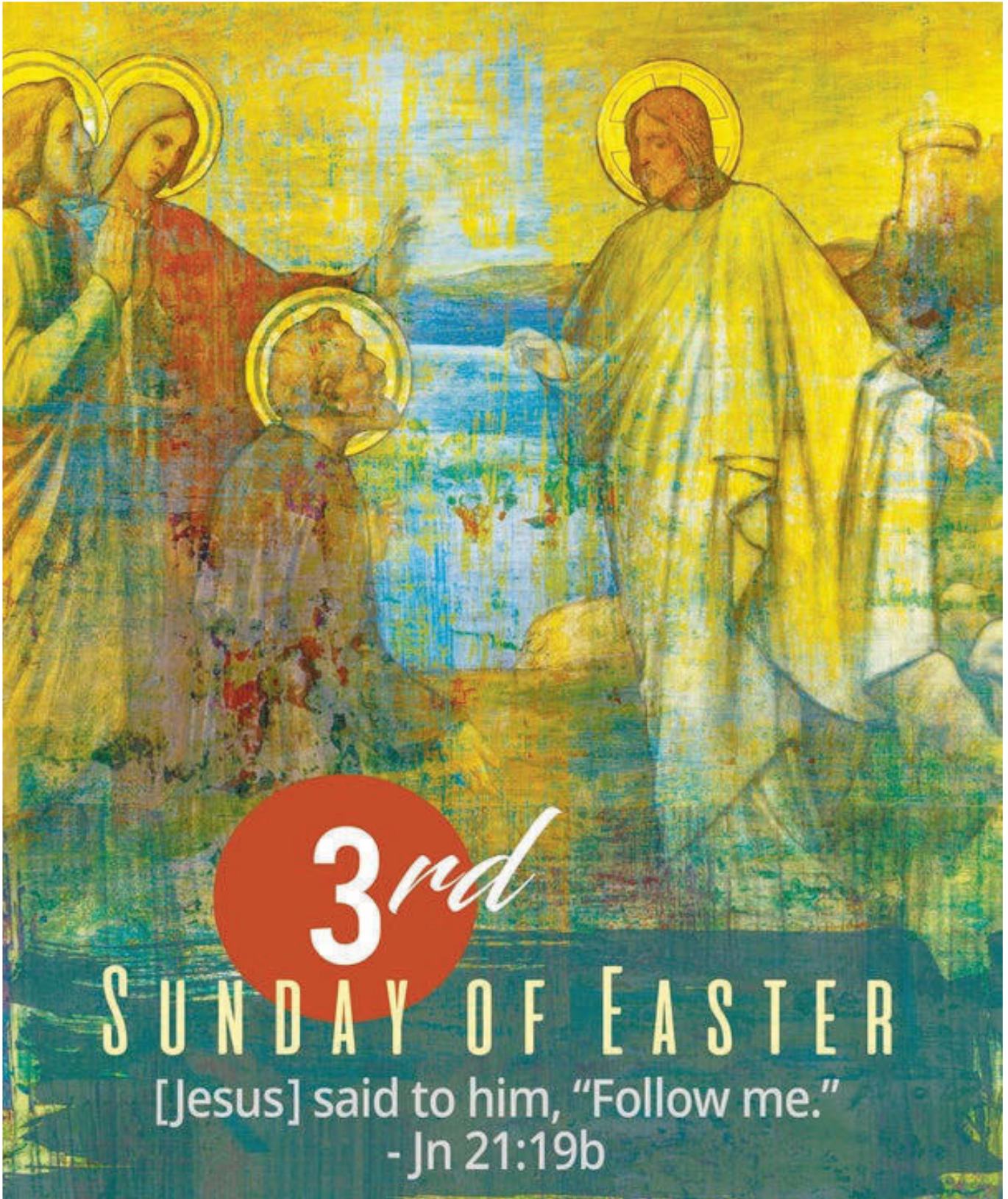


St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church

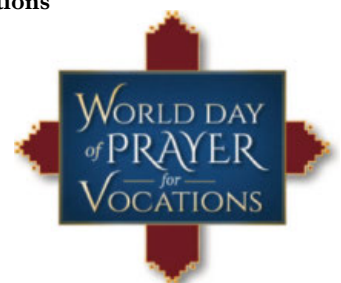

All For The Kids

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

After the announcement this last weekend about the Let MI Kids Learn petition drive, we received some concerned comments about whether this was a political endeavor. This is certainly a fair question.

Now, it is true that the Church needs to stay out of politics to the degree that she should never endorse any political party or candidate. However, it is not true that the Church can never comment or act on issues that pertain to the common good, especially those concerning human rights and dignity.

That is why the Bishops of Michigan and the Michigan Catholic Conference have commented on two recent sets of petition drives that are presently being offered in the public square.

The Let MI Kids Learn petitions (there are two separate petitions) pertain to matters of parental rights in that they make possible more opportunities for parents to guide the education of their children. That parents have a right to the education of their children is a matter of fundamental Catholic teaching:

"As those first responsible for the education of their children, parents have the right to choose a school for them which corresponds to their own convictions. This right is fundamental. As far as possible parents have the duty of choosing schools that will best help them in their task as Christian educators." (Catechism of the Catholic Church #2229)

So, the Bishops, the MCC, and St. Andrew Parish are very much in favor of everyone signing the two petitions for Let MI Kids Learn.

The other petition that the Bishops and the MCC are very much not in favor of, and are asking everyone NOT TO SIGN, is the "Reproductive Freedom for All." This petition seeks to deny the most fundamental right to life for children in the womb. This petition seeks to make abortion legal and unrestricted throughout pregnancy. It also seeks to restrict parental rights regarding their minor daughters who become pregnant. These efforts are fundamentally opposed to human dignity.

Therefore, both sets of petitions directly pertain to issues of the common good by pertaining to the value and dignity of our children. Let MI Kids Learn seeks the good of our children and their parents while the Reproductive Freedom for All does not at all seek the good of children nor does it seek the good of parents who WILL be greatly harmed by abortion.

Therefore, these are not simply "political issues." These are issues of fundamental rights that pertain to children and their parents. God's Church will always have the right to comment on such issues as these.

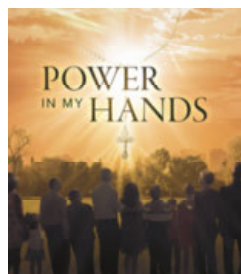


Fall Deeper in Love

Class of 2022 Graduate Mass: June 5 at 11:30am



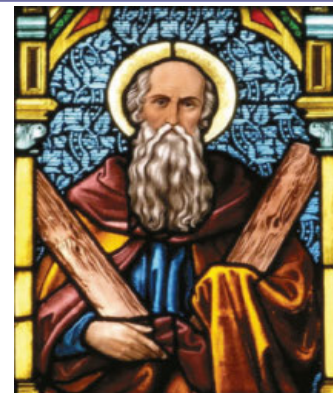

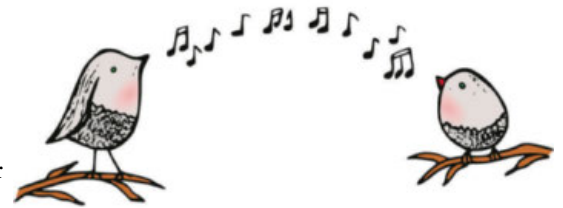

Help the Let MI Kids Learn Petition Drive

From the Michigan Catholic Conference: The **Let MI Kids Learn** petition drive is underway to promote educational justice legislation.

Michigan children from low-income families would qualify for “Student Opportunity Scholarships” toward their out-of-pocket educational costs at public or nonpublic schools for tutoring, school supplies, computers, and tuition among other expenses. Donors to scholarship organizations would receive a state tax credit. Low-income parishioners and members of our community would benefit from this initiated legislation, regardless of where they send their children to school. The petitions would place this proposal before the legislature, and, if approved, would not require the governor’s signature to become law. As this is a nonpartisan effort, Catholic parishes and schools are allowed to circulate petitions.

The Catholic Bishops of Michigan support this effort.

Stop the Abortion Amendment!

Help spread the word about why **people should NOT sign the Reproductive Freedom for All Petition**. A petition drive (**Reproductive Freedom for All**) has started, sponsored by Planned Parenthood and the ACLU, to get a constitutional amendment for an unlimited right to abortion on the November ballot. See the table in the Narthex for more information.

This amendment would repeal dozens of state laws, including our state’s ban on tax-funded abortions, the partial-birth abortion ban, and fundamentally alter the parent-child relationship by preventing parents from having input on their children’s health. The petition drive is also **an attempt to invalidate the state’s long-standing ban on abortion**, which is poised to become effective again, if or when the U.S. Supreme Court overturns Roe v. Wade.

Now, more than ever, **your help is needed** to stand up for the unborn and speak up for the dignity of human life at all stages. This amendment is **opposed** by the Michigan Catholic Conference, the official voice of the Catholic Church in Michigan on public policy.

Reconciliation Room Update

Temporal Arteritis: When A Headache May Be More Than A Headache!



From the Health Ministry: Temporal arteritis, also known as giant cell arteritis (GCA) is a disease of the elderly that occurs only rarely in people under the age of 50. It is an inflammation of blood vessels in and around the scalp, particularly near the temples. The cause is unknown but it can be serious and sometimes results in total blindness if not treated quickly.

It is often associated with polymyalgia rheumatica with symptoms including headaches, jaw and/or scalp pain, decreased vision, fever, and fatigue. Blood tests and biopsy of the temporal artery are done to confirm the diagnosis, but often treatment with oral steroids is started immediately in older individuals with these symptoms. Ophthalmologists often diagnose this condition but the patient may then be seen by a rheumatologist for further testing and follow up.

The Parish Pastoral Council Seeks Candidates

The Parish Pastoral Council is looking for candidates to fill openings for three members whose term of service is up this year. The PPC is a consultative body of parishioners serving as advisors to the Pastor. The purpose of the PPC is to offer the Pastor and other leaders of the Parish support, wisdom and personal insight concerning the mission and direction of the Parish. Qualified candidates should be registered parishioners who are in full communion with the Catholic Church. This is a great opportunity to work with the leadership of the parish and gain great insights into how the parish functions.

The term is 4 years and goes from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2026. The time commitment is one meeting on the fourth Monday of each month, and assisting with various assignments that the PPC works on. Parishioners may recommend other parishioners or nominate themselves as candidates. The openings will be filled by a random drawing of all qualified candidates, held on May 16th. 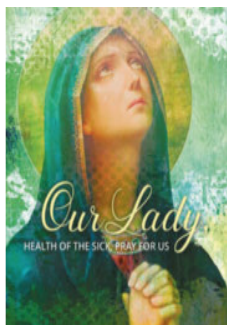

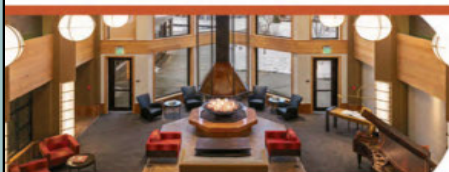

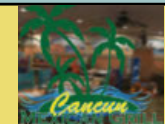
