
St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church

Thank You God, Thank You Mom!

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This week we celebrate Mother's Day and the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, and in a certain way, we combine the two into the celebration of the May Crowning of our Blessed Mother Mary!

Combined, because Mary lived her vocation better than anyone ever has in this world, save for her Divine Son Jesus. And her vocation was to be his – *and our* – mother. In fact, she still lives this vocation in heaven for both her Divine Son and for each of us!

The fact that she still lives the vocation of motherhood says a lot about that vocation. Doctors will no longer be doctors in heaven, and lawyers will be out of work too, but the vocation of mother appears to be *eternal*.

Why, then, do we not celebrate this eternal vocation more than we do? We even, in some ways, make it seem like a second-class job here on earth!

I contend that, in the big picture, motherhood is a very big deal to God, while other careers here on earth, while not unworthy, are still quite insignificant in comparison.

As I said back in August of last year, when my mom went to the Lord: there is no greater devotional love on earth that we may ever receive that comes closer to God's devotional love for us than that of a mother's love.

Now, it's true that our earthly mothers will all come up short in that comparison to some degree, but it doesn't mean that a mother's love is any less important to God. Even if none of our mothers in this world were, or are perfect - that doesn't mean that they weren't perfectly hand-picked for us by God.

God has given to you your mother, and, in fact, has given you two of them - one on earth, and one in heaven. And if a mother's love is the closest to God's love, then by the fact of him giving everyone two mothers, it seems that God has willed a double portion of love for everyone.

Let us all then celebrate our mothers - especially today - by recognizing their eternal vocation of showing us just how much God loves us!





Help me believe that you have a special plan for me. Lord, I know I pass through this life only once; help me decide how you want me to make a difference.


Like our Blessed Mother, give me the wisdom to hear your voice and the courage to answer your call.

Help the Let MI Kids Learn Petition Drive

From the Michigan Catholic Conference: The **Let MI Kids Learn** petition drive is underway to promote educational justice legislation.

Michigan children from low-income families would qualify for "Student Opportunity Scholarships" toward their out-of-pocket educational costs at public or nonpublic schools for tutoring, school supplies, computers, and tuition among other expenses. Donors to scholarship organizations would receive a state tax credit. Low-income parishioners and members of our community would benefit from this initiated legislation, regardless of where they send their children to school. The petitions would place this proposal before the legislature, and, if approved, would not require the governor's signature to become law. As this is a nonpartisan effort, Catholic parishes and schools are allowed to circulate petitions.

The Catholic Bishops of Michigan support this effort.

Please prayerfully consider signing the two required petitions to create the scholarship program and tax credits to improve the education of Michigan's school children.

Stop the Abortion Amendment!

Help spread the word about why $people\ should\ NOT\ sign\ the\ Reproductive\ Freedom$

for All Petition. A petition drive (Reproductive Freedom for All) has started, sponsored by Planned Parenthood and the ACLU, to get a constitutional amendment for an unlimited right to abortion on the November ballot. See the table in the Narthex for more information.

This amendment would repeal dozens of state laws, including our state's ban on tax-funded abortions, the partial-birth abortion ban, and fundamentally alter the parent-child relationship by preventing parents from having input on their children's health. The petition drive is also an attempt to invalidate the state's long-standing ban on abortion, which is poised to become effective again, if or when the U.S. Supreme Court overturns Roe v. Wade.

Now, more than ever, **your help is needed** to stand up for the unborn and speak up for the dignity of human life at all stages. This amendment is **opposed** by the Michigan Catholic Conference, the official voice of the Catholic Church in Michigan on public policy.


Our Prayer to St. Andrew

During the Christmas season, my office, the Lennon Center, was blessed to be the recipient of several Advent Giving Trees. One church gave us many Target gift cards, which I planned to use to purchase clothes and diapers/wipes for our clients.

I went to Target, counted out my cards, and made my purchases. My cart was overflowing, and it took the clerk several minutes to ring up my order, using my gift cards. Upon leaving, he handed me back many of my gift cards, informing me I still had money on them. I was very surprised, as I thought I had used up all the money on the cards.

This happened two more times when I went shopping at Target. The gift cards seemed to multiply every time I went shopping: the multiplying gift cards! Eventually, I did use them all up, or close to it. But I did feel a bit like the story of the loaves and the fish. God knew The Lennon Center needed diapers/wipes and lots of clothes and He provided them for us. I knew God was showing His love for me through this act of mercy and kindness.
