





Teens/Youth Advent Service Blitz Project (continued from Dec. 18/19 bulletin)







The topics of family, honor and obedience connect today's Scripture passages. The Book of Sirach instructs those who respectfully honor their father and revere their mother to atone for their sins and in turn, store up riches. Those who are caregivers for aging parents are also remembered — their generosity is an offering against sin. In St. Luke's Gospel, Mary and Joseph find Jesus in the Temple after a frantic three-day search. The evangelist tells of their return to Nazareth, where Jesus is obedient to them.

Pope St. John Paul II emphasized the family as the "Domestic Church." Archbishop Allen Vigneron also discusses the importance of the "Domestic Church" in his pastoral letter, *Unleash the Gospel* (see: Guidepost 7, Families). 




