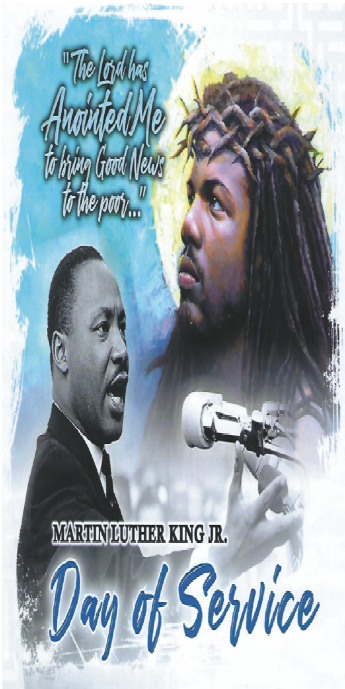


Children's Liturgy
of the **Word**

*****The Parish is hoping to return to the ministry of "Liturgy of the Word for Children" during the 11:30 Mass but we need Liturgical Leaders to help lead our weekly Sunday morning sessions. Leaders choose Sunday dates that they can lead. Training and observance of others is provided. Please call the Faith Formation office (313-565-1020) to volunteer.*****

WHAT IS LITURGY OF THE WORD WITH CHILDREN? Sacred Heart put this program on hold in 2020 due to the pandemic and so some families might not be aware of what this is. At the Sunday 11:30 Mass after the Opening Prayer, children are called forward to go and experience the Liturgy of the Word on their level. This takes place in the Parish Hall with a leader who proclaims the Sunday readings from a Children's Lectionary. The children and leader discuss the readings. They pray the Creed together and then pray Intercessory Prayers. The children are then brought back to Church at the Preparation time so as to participate in the remainder of the Mass with their families.

What would qualify one to be a leader of CLOW? A love of the Mass, a love of children and a willingness to help out where there is a need. Leaders borrow a Sunday liturgy guidebook to help them prepare to lead. New leaders can observe an experienced leader until feeling comfortable to lead solo. Are you a teen, young adult, adult, parent or grandparent being called by the Lord to help fill this need? 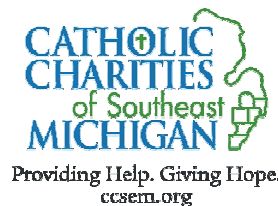


Word of God Sunday

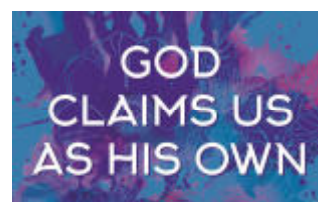

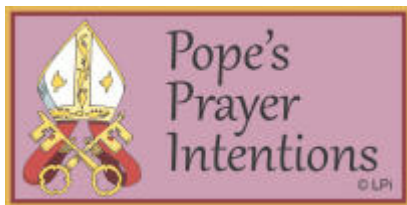

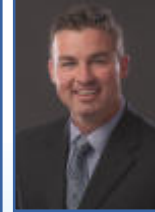
