





#### NEWS FROM THE PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL Six Month (2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter) Update for 2021-2022 Fiscal Year

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

At the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter (6-month period of July 1, 2021 to Dec 31, 2021) Sacred Heart Parish experienced weekly contributions slightly above the budgeted amount. The overall church operating revenue exceeded the budgeted amount, largely due to return of CSA moneys that were over the parish assessment and Christmas donations. The PFC would like to thank all for the generous support of the parish. There were capital expenditures for the much-needed restoration of the Michigan Avenue Building exterior as well as other smaller expenditures.

Weekly offertory receipts are vital to our Parish financial health and are needed and used for operating expenses. They are subject to the AOD 7% assessment, as well as all parish fundraising.

Christmas Collections and CSA collections in excess of the AOD goal are exempt & remain 100% with the Parish.

#### **OTHER FINANCIAL INFORMATION**

**Automatic Electronic Offering Plan** At the end of the year there were 112 parishioners enrolled in this plan. We thank the parishioners who have enrolled and strongly encourage those who have not to consider enrolling in the AEOP plan. The automated offering plan is a great benefit to the parish and makes things easier for you. It reduces the manual effort required of the parish staff and allows the parish to better project income based on your commitment. It frees you from having to write a check, as well as allowing you to provide support of the parish when you are away. Enrollment is easy. Enrollment forms appear periodically in the Guardian and are available on the parish website, **www.shparish.org** click on the **Parish Life tab – Useful forms.** In addition, electronic offering is available through the archdiocese, the link to this offering option can also be found on our parish web site. **2021 AOD Catholic Services Appeal (CSA)** Pledges as of Jan. 14, 2022 totaled \$228,344 which is about 135% above our \$97,261 AOD goal. The AOD goal is an assessment to the parish and all moneys above the goal are being returned to the parish and are free of the AOD 7% assessment. As Fr. Ken mentioned a few months ago, there was a generous \$100,000 donation from a parish family. This in addition to the generosity of the other 302 contributing parish families allowed us to exceed this year's goal. We thank all who supported this appeal.

<u>Mount Kelly Cemetery</u> The main income source for any cemetery is the sale of burial sites. There are a few unsold full burial sites available and a number of cremains burial sites and columbarium niches available. Please contact the cemetery manager for more information. Expenses for cemetery maintenance are ongoing. In addition to routine maintenance, expenses for masonry repairs to the chapel were incurred during the quarter. Also, storms necessitated tree trimming expenditures that will be realized in the third quarter of this year. Mainly due to the sale of columbarium niches the quarter ended with income exceeding expenses by \$2,833. Donations and bequests to Mt. Kelly continue to aid the beautification and upkeep of the cemetery and are deeply appreciated.

**Major Projects** Major projects recently completed include installation of 2 new boilers to supply heat to the Michigan and Garrison buildings, improvement of church and hall sound systems, and replacement of water damaged pew panels in the church. A major project currently in process is the work on the Michigan Building, which includes sealing of windows, painting of the window panels, repair of cast concrete and sealing of limestone. The west side of the building has been completed and work started on the east side, when this project resumes in the spring, it will help ensure the integrity of the building for years to come.

**Future Projects** The Finance Council participates with our Buildings & Grounds staff in semi-annual walk arounds. We inspect our campus and buildings to ensure that things are in good shape and that we continue to be good stewards of our parish properties. A walk around occurred on October 9, 2021 with particular emphasis on the church interior and an additional inspection of the Garrison Bldg. occurred on January 4, 2022. Future projects being considered for the church are improvements to the handicap door operation , updating of emergency exit signage and lighting, and replacement of damaged tile. Also, improvements to the Garrison Bldg under review are updates to the boy's restroom facilities, refinishing of some woodwork, intensive tile and grout cleaning, and improved landscaping. These projects are being prioritized with previously identified Maintenance & Capital Improvement Projects.

<u>Sacred Heart School</u> Our school continues to function at a high level. Enrollment in the Kindergarten through Grade 8 is 194 students. We also have 23 students enrolled in the pre-school program. Open house programs are planned during Catholic Schools weeks for tours of the school facilities for prospective new student families.

**2022/2023 FY Budget Preparation** In November the PFC reviewed and approved the school tuition rates presented by the principal for the 2022/23 school year. The tuition rates were approved to accommodate registration during Catholic Schools Week. In February, the budget committee will begin work with the parish business manager to prepare the complete parish, school, and religious education budget for the upcoming fiscal year. The budget must be submitted to the AOD by May 15, 2022.

**2021 Contribution Statements for Tax Purposes** Statements will be available by the end of January. Please contact the parish office for email or postal mail delivery, if you require a statement.

**Stewardship** The Parish Finance Council recognizes that the various projects noted in this report have been possible because of your stewardship. Your continued support of the parish is greatly appreciated.

**Bequest: A Way of Stewardship** Sacred Heart has been the fortunate beneficiary of several bequests over the years, ranging from small to large to very large. Those gifts allow us to address some unbudgeted repairs and projects. Funds bequeathed to us are not used for general operating purposes; they are used for purposes as directed by the donor. Funds with no stipulation are set aside in savings for major needs of the parish. Remember, charitable giving from a will or trust is a way to support the parish in the future.

We are truly blessed to have so many generous stewards and are thankful for the gifts that you have made to Sacred Heart Parish. *Remember, God is the giver of all that we have!* May God Bless you abundantly for your support!
