


Youth Ministry

Service day for Martin Luther King Jr.

27 parishes, more than 600 volunteers across Archdiocese of Detroit participated in Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service on Jan. 15. At Sacred Heart and Divine Child parishes in Dearborn, Julie Wieleba-Milkie led a group of middle school and high school students in baking casseroles for Crossroads Soup Kitchen in Detroit, sandwiches for Orthodox Detroit Outreach and St. Christine's Soup Kitchen, making Valentine's Day cards for a senior center and decorating cheery tote bags for Hands Across Haiti. In order to maintain King's spirit and teach the students, Wieleba-Milkie utilized special teaching and prayer materials offered by the archdiocese to help students make the connection between Catholic social teaching and King's life of charity.

"It's one thing for them to say, 'Oh, I'm going to make a casserole.' But if they have no idea why they're making the casserole, then there's a piece missing," Wieleba-Milkie said. "This weekend is in connection with Martin Luther King and his message of helping others and always being in service to those around us."

Wieleba-Milkie hopes to help students understand that connection, but also the deeper connection between service and their Catholic faith. "Jesus was the very first one who taught us that we are called to serve and not be served, and that we have to be disciples who serve," Wieleba -Milkie said.
