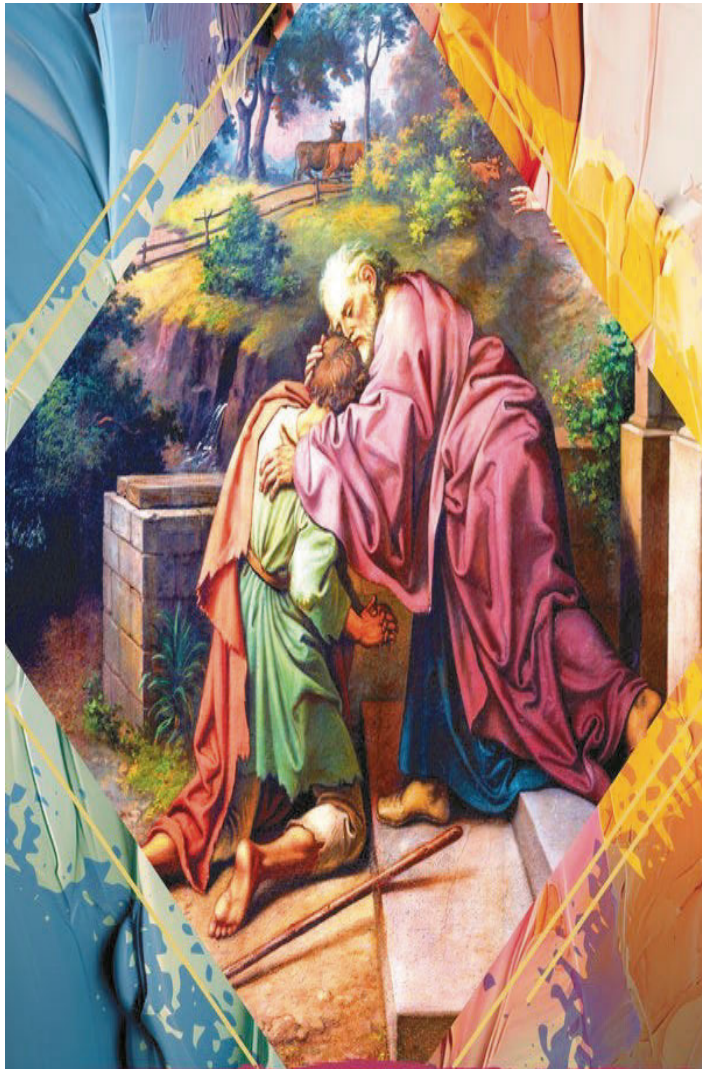

Soup and Prayer - Monday, March 31

Please join us for a simple Soup Supper on Monday, March 31, at 6:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall. Soup will be followed by praying the Seven Sorrows Rosary in Church at 7:00 p.m. The Seven Sorrows Rosary is a variation of the traditional rosary. It is made up of seven decades of seven Hail Mary's, with the Lord's Prayer and other specific prayers interspersed. Each decade begins with the Scripture reading for one of the sorrows of Mary. Participants will receive a handout with directions and the special prayers needed.

Volunteers are needed to bring soup or bread each week. The "clean up" from the supper will take place after the prayer service so that all can participate in the prayer. Sacred Heart Adult Confirmation Preparation

Are you an adult, practicing Catholic, 18 years or older, who has not yet celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation? Would you like to publicly confirm your baptismal commitment by completing your initiation into the Church? If the answer is yes to each of these questions, please read on to find out how you can prepare for the celebration of Confirmation.

Each Pentecost Sunday adults from all over the Archdiocese of Detroit who have been prepared in their parishes or vicariates come together to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. This celebration takes place at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament, with one of our Bishops.

At Sacred Heart we are offering a six-week preparation time for those adult Catholics who practice their faith and who wish to be confirmed on **Pentecost Sunday, June 8, 2025** or in their own parishes the next time the bishop comes for Confirmation. These sessions are open to anyone who is eligible and who may want to prepare for Confirmation. To be eligible means you are a baptized Catholic who has received their First Communion, you regularly attend Mass, and if you are married it is a marriage valid in the Catholic Church.

The preparation sessions will be held on the six Thursdays of Easter season, **beginning May 1, 2025 from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m.** The 6 sessions will cover the following topics through presentations and discussions:

- **Session 1 – The Journey of Faith**
- **Session 2 – The Bible**
- **Session 3 – Sacraments of Baptism & Confirmation**
- **Session 4 – The Eucharist/ Walk through Mass**
- **Session 5 – Penance & Anointing of Sick**
- **Session 6 - Why do I need the Church?**

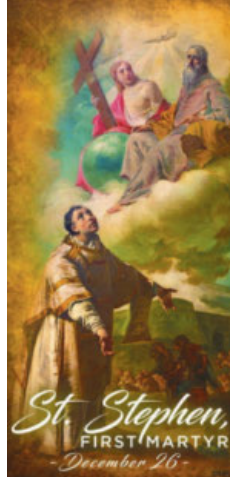

My Confirmation Name: Stephen

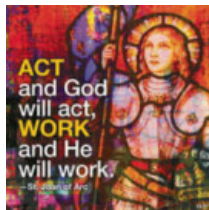

My name is Kate Larabee and the name I am taking when I celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation is JOAN, after the saint, Joan of Arc.



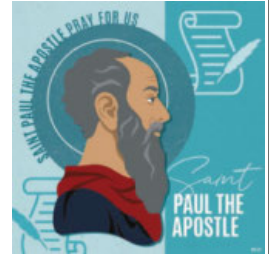

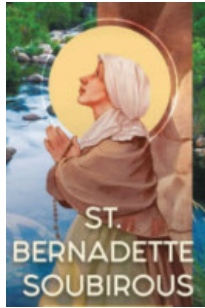

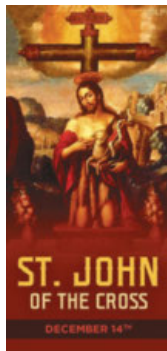

2025 SHAA Annual Scholarship Time

Sacred Heart Alumni Association is once again pleased to announce a high school scholarship opportunity. SHAA has been awarding scholarships since 2014. We are indebted to our SHAA friends who have donated to support and encourage pursuit of a Catholic high school education.

Students entering ninth grade in area Catholic High Schools in Fall 2025 are invited to participate in a short essay competition to earn SHAA scholarship assistance.

This year four possible scholarships are offered. Two special scholarships will have a value of \$2500 each and offered to 2025 8th grade graduates of Sacred Heart Elementary. Two **additional** \$500 Board Scholarships continue to be offered to either 2025 graduates of our parish elementary, or students of active Sacred Heart Parish families who will graduate from other grade schools, or homeschooled who aspire to move on to a Catholic high school experience.

Application details will be available for pickup by request from the parish office, or can be emailed on request (see below). Completed applications can be returned in person to the parish office, or mailed. All applications must be received no later than Friday, May 9th. Candidates must be accepted to 9th grade at a Metro area Catholic high school. Awards will be paid directly to the high school on the student's behalf.
