

## One Nation Under God

Rooted in the Gospel and illuminated by our tradition of trust in the Holy Spirit, Our Catholic faith seeks to make the world more like the Reign of God as Jesus describes it. ("Thy kingdom come...") And it's hard to imagine a better place to work on this project than here in this nation, under God.

Over the Memorial Day weekend, we had the opportunity to listen to the stirring words of "America, the Beautiful" as a prelude to each of the weekend Masses, and then to sing it together on the morning of the holiday itself. It's a beautiful prayer that our nation might remember, strive for, and achieve its very highest ideals.

This text has some truly marvelous poetry and imagery for America at its very best. Is there one phrase that especially resonates with you? How can you, as a Catholic, advance the particular quality that has caught your attention? (You have until the Fourth of July to decide!) Would this make an interesting discussion among your family members?

*Amber waves of grain:* In a nation of abundance, why are people hungry? What can we do to help address this challenge?

*Purple mountain majesties:* God's creation is entrusted to our care so that future generations can thrive as we have. What would make us better stewards of this precious gift?

*Crown thy good with brotherhood:* How can we connect better as members of God's family?

*A thoroughfare for freedom:* Does everyone in this beautiful country enjoy the freedoms that you do? What can we do to ensure that they do?

*God mend thine every flaw:* Recognizing that we have not fully achieved every ideal is not something to feel guilty about, but an opportunity to do better, with God's help. What can we do better?

*Confirm thy soul in self-control, thy liberty in law:* How does the message of the Gospel help us to discipline our life so that liberty is extended more fully? ("discipline" = "disciple")

*Alabaster cities, undimmed by human tears:* How can we as Catholics help to wipe away the tears of those among us who suffer in poverty, illness, hunger, injustice?

*For heroes proved in liberating strife:* Our faith is built on the foundation that the martyrs laid down along with their lives. Our nation's privileges have a similar foundation. What does our faith say to us about this?

*Who more than self their country loved, and mercy more than life:* Mercy is the hallmark of Jesus. How can we help our nation to show mercy as a sign of true strength?

## Gospel Meditation

### The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

As our world faces so much turmoil and change, it is now more important than ever to remember who God is, who we are and where we are going. It is easy to get distracted and lose focus, especially when we are being pulled in so many directions. We can not only lose sight of God but one another. Maintaining our well developed and mature relationships with God and one another is essential to continuing to live, healthy, happy, and focused lives. In a message to young people, Pope Benedict XVI said, "the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist." What is true for those who are younger is even truer for those who are older. Regardless of how the particulars of life change over time, human beings are still hard-wired to seek the fullness of life and happiness. How we embark on this journey and what we choose along the way will indicate whether we meet success.

There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost, feeling lonely, anxious, marginalized, victimized, isolated, oppressed, and abused. Every time we receive the Body of Christ, we have an opportunity to become what we eat. The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us and effects change in ourselves and in the lives of those we meet. We are given the grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God's sacred Presence within us wherever we go. Our faith community is ignited with the fire of God's love and stands out as a beacon of hope in a world that is lost. This is the only way we can discover peace-filled resolutions to violence and create innovative solutions to what is fueling its need in the first place. True happiness, for the young and old alike, becomes an obtainable goal.

St. John Maria Vianney says it so well. "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, he would have given it to us." Only the Eucharist has the ability to connect, sustain, strengthen, and properly orient us, not only on the road of this life but the road to life eternal. Knowing this, when life gets challenging, unsettling, and difficult, we can rely on and cling to this gift we have in the Real Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with God celebrates God's unconditional love for us and grounds us to the truth of who we are in a way nothing else is able to do. Because through the Eucharist we really do become the Body of Christ, we are also bonded together in a most perfect way to one another as that Body. Nourished, united, and strengthened by the Eucharist, let us individually and collectively, bring this wonderful gift to all we meet, especially the poor with whom we have a special connection. ©LPI

*May God thy gold refine:* Wealth and power bring responsibility. What is our role in God's work of refining our power so that justice, love, and mercy are its goals?



Don't try to tackle all of these; pick one that speaks to you. May God bless America and her people, and may God strengthen our Catholic faith as we go about our daily American life.






