PASTOR'S LETTER



Dear friends of St. Philip,

As a nation, mid-January brings us to a historical reflection on the place of race and color in our history and our current society. This Monday most of the nation will observe (Rev. Dr.) Martin Luther King Jr. Day, in honor of the man who stood at the center of the midtwentieth century struggle for civil rights for African Americans. While these events were especially focused in the American South, they hold im-

portant significance for our nation as a whole. Although legal segregation and "Jim Crow" laws were primarily a Southern phenomenon, they were not unknown in the North and West, and have left legal, social, and individual scars across our land.

As a nation, we continue to struggle with the questions at the center of the Civil Rights movement. Today, the reflection we engage in is perhaps less about legal barriers and rights and more about access to opportunities, cultural barriers, and the regard for each individual that we encounter. In these things, I am ill equipped to talk about anyone else's experience. I know for myself that I encounter in my own attitudes the effects of growing up in a racially divided society. The area where I grew up was fairly divided along black and white lines. These lines were accentuated by historical experiences of slavery, social and legal subjugation, importing of poor Black workers from the South to break strikes, and violent riots in response. The use of race in pitting one class of Americans against another is an old story.

That's why I think this holiday and its observance is important to us as individuals and as a nation. This opportunity to examine my part in the ongoing struggle to love my neighbor as myself is a necessary part of my ongoing conversion to Christ, Who came to redeem all men and women. This has been a challenge as long as there have been people, to see each one in his or her innate dignity, and resist the easy and lazy habit of dehumanizing by group or generalization. The enemy of mankind has sown some of his greatest work in racial hatred, that allows us to dismiss "them". May this day of national observance be an occasion of being a neighbor to those whom history has burdened in division.



SANCTITY OF LIFE SUNDAY PRAYER SERVICE AND "ROE V. WADE" FILM JANUARY 16, 2022 AT 3:30 PM ST. JOSEPH CHURCH

Please join the Tri-Parish Pro-Life Ministry for their annual prayer service that commemorates the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision. Fr. Chris Ankley will lead us in prayer for the unborn at St. Joseph Church. Please join us, on this the 48th anniversary of the legalization of abortion, to pray that our current Supreme Court will overturn this decision that has allowed the killing of more than 60 million babies in this country. Afterwards, the film "Roe V. Wade" will be shown in the school cafeteria. This is a docudrama (112 minutes long) that was released in April 2021 directed by and starring Nick Loeb. It also stars John Voight, Stacy Dash, Corbin Bernsen, John Schneider, and Joey Lawrence among others.
