

People tend to prefer darkness more than light, even the most spiritually sensitive among us. The light always carries with it the richness of God's mercy and compassion which see beyond ideologies and concepts to relationships that cultivate life, earthly and eternal. Every hand of compassion and mercy extended to a human being must always point back to God. The call always involves ordering our lives in accord with our truth and essence of being. As God never forgets us, we must never forget God. Now is the time to take stock of our infidelity and return to the light, even though it is difficult to look at.

*A Note from the Pastor...*

**The Fourth Sunday of Lent is *Laetare Sunday*.** The word *Laetare* comes from the first words of the introit to Mass: *Laetare, Jerusalem* (Rejoice with Jerusalem and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning: exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast. Isaiah 66:10-11). This marks the halfway point and a short respite in the penitential season marked by rose vestments instead of violet. There is a joyful note in the Mass because of the ancient practice of presenting and handing on the Apostles' Creed to the catechumens, who were/are preparing for baptism and full initiation into the Church at the Easter Vigil. The altar may also be decorated with flowers to mark this Sunday of rejoicing in the Lord.

**The past year has been challenging** and marked with many changes to our normal way of life. The pandemic has brought isolation, suffering, sickness and personal losses to many individuals and families. On top of all this it was a presidential election year in the United States. During these very polarized times this brought many more challenges to our nation. We have become much more conscious of the power of social media and the internet to influence how we understand ourselves, our nation, and our politics. We have seen the rise of a culture bent on destroying any ideas or individuals who hold views contrary to their own worldview. Traditional values and our common history have been called into question; many of which have been discarded and sacrificed to the spirit of our age. Ideology has usurped civil discourse and real debate about how we are to live in relationship with our neighbor. The civil society as enumerated in the *Declaration of Independence* and *Constitution of the United States of America* is seemingly drifting away in these dislocating times.

**Unity has been replaced by dissension and division.** It seems that we live in a period of revisionist reasoning without a shared conviction about objective truths, and/or what constitutes genuine freedom and liberty for all. Conspiracy theories abound to explain all the chaos and problems that seem to be beyond our control. At the root of all these perceived problems is a spiritual crisis that affects all mankind; we have become like sheep without a shepherd. **The original sin to choose for ourselves what is good and evil is the spirit of our age.** Without God at the center of our lives and sovereign over creation we live in fear. We have replaced the sure foundation of faith in God for the shifting sands of own desires and political correctness. False prophets and misguided false messiahs promise to lead us out of the present darkness into the promised land; a utopia created by man that is marked by the absence of God. This is nothing more than hell on earth; an existence in a world without God. In our spiritual blindness we have forfeited the happiness and harmony assured by the beatitudes, a life of virtue, and obedience to the commandments of God. Our only recourse is genuine repentance and a spiritual renewal rooted in the infinite mercies of Jesus Christ, our Lord and God. He is *the way, the truth and the life*.

**We are not people without hope. Like ancient Israel, we too rejoice because our hope is in the Lord.** God is our salvation and is closer to us than we are to ourselves. *"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."* The Gospel of Jesus Christ is a stumbling block to the Jews and foolishness to the gentiles, but it is life to those who place their trust in Him. The penitential season of Lent is nothing more than a clarion call to return to the Lord with all our heart, all our strength, and all our soul. Only in him will we find purpose and meaning in our lives. In Jesus, we see creation restored and find the peace which the world cannot give. Let us embrace the promises of faith and the light that has given to a people living in darkness. In his person, Jesus is the gift of God that has been promised to all people in every age for his glory and our good. Praise be to our Lord and Savior –Jesus Christ, who is our hope and our life.

## Diocesan Services Appeal DSA 2021


Our Diocesan Services Appeal is underway! I invite all members of our parish community to join in support of our annual appeal. Our parish goal is \$41,480.00.
