

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Shout for joy! When was the last time you ever felt like doing that? Fear, uncertainty, pressure, negativity, disappointment, and myriad other human experiences can rob us of joy. We can never predict what life will bring. As unsettling as that can often seem, life's unpredictability is also the very thing that allows it to be exciting and adventuresome! We know that life can be difficult, and it is unrealistic to expect it to be otherwise. God never promised an easy road. But, when a person truly falls in love with God and discovers the peacefulness and assurance of God's presence, then a depth of understanding will be brought to everything they do and experience. Nothing will be able to rob them of joy! When we realize that God, the King of Israel, is in our midst and with us, there is no further misfortune to fear. We celebrate the beauty and wonder of God's gift of joy today as we ready ourselves, even more excitedly, for the coming of our Savior. Do not fear and do not be discouraged. There is a power and presence within us, our God, who has made us, who loves us and who will keep us. What more do we need? Rejoice!



SAINT OF THE WEEK

A name that means "light," St. Lucy (283 – 304) is the patron saint of those blind or suffering with eye trouble. Not much is known about her life, except that she was determined to remain a virgin and thus refused marriage. History tells the story of a frustrated suitor who eventually accused St. Lucy of being a Christian (at crime at the time), and she was executed in Syracuse, Sicily, in the year 304.

Today, we celebrate a number of traditions that incorporate symbolic meaning of St. Lucy as the "bearer" of light in the darkness of winter. This is particularly seen in Scandinavian countries, with their long dark winters. There, a young girl dressed in a white dress and a red sash (as the symbol of martyrdom) carries palms and wears a crown or wreath of candles on her head. In Denmark, Norway and Sweden, girls dressed as Lucy carry rolls and cookies in procession as songs are sung.



NOTES FROM THE PASTOR... Fr. Roy Horning

It is *Gaudete Sunday*, the Third Sunday of Advent, setting a tone of joyful expectation for the celebration of the Lord's birth and Glorious Second Coming. *Gaudete* is Latin and comes from the word "rejoice" in the Entrance Antiphon: *Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near* (Philip[pians 4:4-5). We joyfully await the feast of the Lord's Nativity and look forward to celebrating it always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing, says our Opening Prayer on this joyful Sunday. The rose colored vestments capture the joy and anticipation we have for the great feast of Christmas. There is a newness and freshness to the message of our Lord's humble birth in Bethlehem stable. The God of all creation, for whom and through whom all things exist, humbled himself, and took upon himself our poverty becoming one like us in all things but sin. He became man in order that 'we could see Him with our own eyes, hear Him with our ears, and touch Him with our hands' as St. John testifies to in his 1st Letter. God took it upon himself to do for us what we are incapable of doing; conquering sin and death while simultaneously opening the path to heaven for those who love Him. Indeed, this is the reason to rejoice in the Lord always!

Now all the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John the Baptist answered them saying, I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming...He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire (Luke 3:15-16). I teach and preach frequently of our need to live lives of faith. In *Magnificat* this Sunday there is a reflection by Blessed John Baptist Scalabrini, who was the Bishop of Piacenza Italy and entered eternal life in 1905. He tures very eloquently what I am trying to help us grasp and live out with all our heart, soul and strength. He writes, "We must not simply live in Jesus Christ. Rather he himself must be our life and must live in us. He must live in us with his spirit, with his grace, with the impression of his mysteries, with the plication of this merits, with the efficacy of his sacraments, above all with the sacrament of this Body and Blood so that we can say with the Apostle Paul: yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me (Gal 2:20)." Blessed John fleshes this out concretely by stating, "He loves with our heart, thinks with our mind, speaks with our tongue, and works with our hands." This is the goal of our spiritual lives as It is a high bar that is attained only through much prayer, sacrifice, penance and self-offering of our lives to God and his Divine Will. Like silver that is purified it is a process that takes time and attention. But, this is exactly what Jesus is asking of us and it is achievable as all the saints of God bear witness. This is not something reserved only for the canonized Saints of the Church, but is for all God's holy men and women who follow Jesus Christ. This is the work that St. Paul prayed for last week in his Letter to the Philippians, "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will plete it until the day of Christ Jesus. God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus." This is also my prayer for you and me; that we will continue to grow in faith, hope and charity bearing witness with the whole of our lives to God's glory and our good. Have a blessed Gaudete Sunday and may we rejoice in the good work that God is doing in us!
