

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

While we have to be cognizant of our societal and personal responsibilities in this world, we can never lose sight of where our true citizenship lies — heaven. When we become too immersed in earthly things and too preoccupied with our temporal responsibilities, we can actually become numb to our faith. Becoming ambivalent about our faith, our belief in Jesus Christ and the promises of heaven become more a source of agitation rather than a source of promise and hope. It is easy to become an enemy of Christ without even knowing it is happening. God has given us a very clear destiny. We are definitely not meant to conform ourselves to this world but to the transfiguration and glorification of our bodies to come. It is here where we can see clearly not only who God is but who we are. The way many conduct the daily business of their lives suggests that such a promise or hope is of little importance. What does the way you live your daily life say about you?



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

St. Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland. He spent six long years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.

His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ.



NOTES FROM THE PASTOR... Fr. Roy Horning

In Luke's Gospel this weekend, we hear his account of the Transfiguration on the mountain with Peter, James and John in attendance. Jesus had taken these three apostles with him to pray. In anticipation of his arrest, Passion and Death Jesus wanted to reveal His Glory to them to strengthen them for the scandal of the Cross. He knew it would shake them to the core of their faith in him; he gave them a moment of incredible grace to build them up for what was ordained by his Father for the redemption and salvation of the world. Again, we see the compassion, mercy and concern that our Lord has for those who believe and trust in him. The voice from the cloud (Our Heavenly Father) said: "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." Such a clear command that generations of disciples have taken to heart and bore fruit in our world for the Glory of God.

St. Cyprian, bishop and martyr, in his treatise on the Lord's Prayer gives us some very sound teaching of the efficacy and need to pray as Jesus taught us. He wrote: "Dear brothers, the commands of the Gospel are nothing else than God's lessons, the foundations on which to build up hope, the supports for strengthening faith, the food that nourishes the heart. They are the rudder for keeping us on the right course, the protection that keeps our salvation secure. As they instruct the receptive minds of believers on earth, they lead safely to the kingdom of heaven...The Lord has given us many counsels and commandments to help us toward salvation. He has given us a pattern of prayer, instructing us on how we are to pray. He has given us life, and with his accustomed generosity, he has also taught us how to pray. He has made it easy for us to be heard as we pray to the Father in the words taught us by the Son." What prayer could be more a prayer in the spirit than the one given us by Christ, by whom the Holy Spirit was sent upon us?

St. Teresa of Avila has some great insights in how we can truly pray in humility and trust to our Father through his Son in the unity of the Holy Spirit. She writes: "There are many souls who close their ears against Him because they prefer to speak and hurry through vocal prayers as if a task had been set for them to say a certain amount of prayer every day. Do not imitate them. You are doing more by occasionally repeating a single petition of the Paternoster (the Our Father) than by repeating the whole of it many times in a hurry and not thinking about what you are saying. When you say 'Thy will be done', you are begging that God's will may be carried out in you, for it is this, and nothing else, for which you ask."

"You need not fear that He will give you riches or pleasures, or great honors, or any earthly good—His love for you is not so lukewarm. He places a higher value on your gift and wishes to reward you generously, since He gives you His kingdom even in this life. Ask His glorious Son, Who in the garden uttered this petition truthfully and resolutely. See whether the will of God was not accomplished in the trials, sufferings, insults and persecution sent Him, until at last his life was ended on the Cross. Thus, you see what God gave to Him He loved best. I believe that our love is the measure of the Cross, great or small, that we can bear." St. Philip Neri (1515-1595) said in essence the same truths that St. Teresa is expounding on. He said, 'Jesus shares with his friends a share of his sufferings on the Cross.' Our love of the Lord and his love and friendship with him are tested and strengthened by his sharing with us a portion of his sufferings for the redemption and salvation of the world. He desires and wills that we participate in our salvation and the salvation of sinners. The rewards of a life lived in faith in the Son of God is a share in his sufferings. The Father wills that the entire Body of Christ work in communion with his Son, our Head, for the salvation of souls. The spiritual truth is simply that there is no salvation of souls without suffering. This is also conveyed to us in that old adage "to offer up our suffering to God". In a world that wants to eliminate and avoid suffering this is a difficult teaching that is hard to accept; even we disciples find it hard and uncomfortable. However, it is a reminder that we live in the world but are not of the world. We belong to Christ Jesus and his Kingdom; in him are adopted sons and daughters of the Father. Let us keep these truths in mind the next time we pray the Our Father, and when trials, tribulations and suffering come our way. Lent is a great time to allow the Holy Spirit to renovate our spiritual homes; this is the process of conversion. The Greek word "metanoia" means repent, literally to change the way we see and understand our lives in the world as men and women of Christian faith. God's grace changes the inevitable sufferings of our lives into redemptive grace if we cooperate with his Divine Will.

Thanks to the generosity of the parish communities of Holy Rosary, St. Mary,


St. John/Blessed Sacrament, St. Francis and St. Charles and Helena and many business community donations, our recent fundraiser was a huge success!
