Notes from the Pastor... Fr. Roy Horning

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord is this Sunday. The Church in the west celebrates the Epiphany by celebrating the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles, as represented in Matthew's gospel by the Magi, or three wise men. The Church in the east celebrates the Epiphany by focusing on the baptism of Christ. Both "lungs of the Church" (JPII) celebrate the visible manifestation of Christ, our Lord and God, to mankind. It is interesting that both themes celebrate a central truth of the Gospel that God's salvation is offered to all peoples, not solely his Chosen People—the Jews. At the Nativity of the Lord, we celebrated our Lord's birth; one like us in all things but sin. St. John the Evangelist taught clearly the truth of the Incarnate Lord when he wrote: Beloved: What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked upon and touched with our hands concerns the Word of life—for the life was made visible; we have seen and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was visible to us (Jn. 1:1-4). Matthew and Luke make it clear in their gospel accounts that the Son of God became flesh to save sinners and make manifest God's love. The Magi are the first of many, many Gentiles who recognized in the Christ child his divine and human natures united in the person of the Son of God.

Some scoff at the thought that God would lower himself and become like the creatures he formed in his own image and likeness. This is especially true of those who practice Islam. But, far more common is that Jesus is not even an afterthought during the Christmas season. The birth of the Savior having been replaced by mere human sentimentality that focuses on decorated trees, presents, and family gatherings filled with warm memories of Christmas's past; effectively having excised Jesus Christ from Christmas. Xmas has sadly become a reality for many. This is not true of the Church, we boldly proclaim the Christmas message of God's love for his creation. The Magi from the East are essential to understanding God's will that desires that all mankind be saved. It is a point repeated throughout the gospels: the Samaritan woman at the well, the healing of the centurion's son, the exorcism of the Syrophoenician woman's daughter, and many more non-Jews were healed. The universal call to salvation is made explicit in the Great Commission given to the eleven apostles by the Risen Lord: Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. From beginning to end the evangelist's put details of Jesus' infancy, ministry, passion, death and resurrection to emphasize the universal nature of the Savior's mission to save his people from their sins.

The Baptism of the Lord is celebrated on Monday, January 9th. A Mass will be celebrated at 8:30AM at Holy Rosary. This feast concludes the Christmas season in the Roman Catholic liturgical year. I mention it hear for it is the exclamation point for the whole celebration and message of Christmas. In his baptism, by John the Baptist, Jesus unites himself with sinners. He who never sinned, freely and willingly receives John's baptism for the forgiveness of sins. The early Church fathers saw in his actions that Jesus was in fact consecrating the water, and was giving his future disciples the example to follow. Through the waters of baptism all who follow Him would become a new Creation in Christ. In baptism, we receive the gift the Holy Spirit and become the adopted Sons and Daughters of God. Just as a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased", so the same applies to us. Christmas began with the love of God made visible and ends with the invitation to all humanity to live in his love. The Church's new year began with the 1st Sunday of Advent and will progress with purpose to the Feast of Christ the King; the feast that points to the end of time and culmination of all things in Christ. Then and only then will we have the fullness of life in God; a life that is an eternal communion of love with the Holy Trinity. If it all seems too incredible, it surely is but nonetheless it is true for all who have faith in God!


