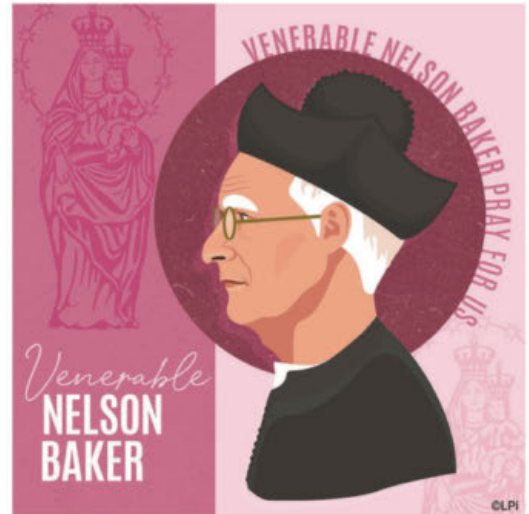

Notes from the Pastor...
Fr. Roy Horning

This weekend the gospel is Jesus teaching the Beatitudes in his Sermon on the Mount. They are the spiritual keys to living as a disciple. It takes recognition for disciples to understand that we are always in the process of conversion: of our hearts, minds and lives. Cooperating with God's grace, we are disciples on the path to becoming saints. I have "five principles of the spiritual life" that are written on a 3x5 card that I keep in my pocket. They help to keep me focused on the goal, which is Jesus and the Kingdom of God. Rule #5 is: There are no short cuts in the spiritual life. It's a reminder that if the spiritual life was easy everyone would be doing it. I mention this because the Beatitudes are the fruit of our relationship with the Lord and the transforming power of his love at work in our hearts. However, in order for this to occur we have to spend time with Him; over time we come to know the Lord and his ways.

Here are five essential things necessary for growing in the spiritual life. **1) Prayer:** We need to have a regular disciplined life of daily prayer. Concretely this means setting aside time every day to talk to the Lord and just as importantly listen to Him. **2) Sacraments:** We participate in the sacramental life of the Church. We attend and receive Holy Communion each week at Sunday Mass and on Holy Days of Obligation. Also, we regularly go to confession and celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. **3) Devotions:** We have a life that is marked by spiritual practices that keep Jesus before our eyes and known as devotions. These may include the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Stations of the Cross, Novena's, Holy Hours of Adoration, etc. These are spiritual practices that keep Jesus close to our hearts and minds throughout the week. **4) Spiritual Reading:** We keep our minds sharp and intellectually stimulated by spending time reading and learning about our Catholic faith. We regularly read and reflect upon the Sacred Scriptures. We might study the Catechism of the Catholic Church, read about the lives of the saints or the spiritual life as taught by the Doctors of the Church. We don't have to reinvent the wheel, rather we walk with those holy men and women who act as our guides in the spiritual life. **5) Communal Life:** It is important that we live and practice our faith within the community of the Church. It is within the community of faith that we practice the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. This is where love of neighbor is manifested in actions directed towards the good of another. Communal life also acts as an excellent 'checks and balances' for our spiritual lives. We hold ourselves accountable to Holy Mother Church; living lives in continuity with the Tradition of the Church and firmly rooted in the apostolic faith. **These are five hallmarks of an ordinary life of faith.**

These spiritual practices are supported by the two great pillars of obedience and humility. We are obedient to the Commandments of God and the teachings of Jesus Christ, as taught to us by the apostles and their successors—the bishops of the Catholic Church. Humility is the virtue by which we admit that we are not God, and in fact are prone to error due to the wound of original sin. It's an admission that we can and often make mistakes in judgment. Thus, we submit our lives to lawful authority. Growing up in our families this was our parents. Throughout our lives we do the same with the Church in matters of faith and morals. St. Ignatius of Loyola spends a significant amount of time in his Spiritual Exercises helping the retreatant understand these two principles in his discussion of the Two Standards. He posits that life is a spiritual battle between two armies, hence there are two flags or standards on the field of battle; The Standard of Christ, or the Standard of Satan (the diabolical). He poses three questions: 1) What is the true life? 2) What is true freedom? 3) Who is the Word, the rule and law of life? His answers are the Spiritual Life, a truly free life is the life lived under rule—a life lived according to God's pattern, and Christ is the one under whom I live in obedience and humility. When we get this right, we have the promise and hope of eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven. Are the Beatitudes important? Absolutely!!! They are the signs that we have answered Ignatius' questions correctly and are living lives of faith in communion with the Living God. I invite us all to ponder these things and recommit ourselves to following Christ and conforming our hearts to his Sacred Heart.

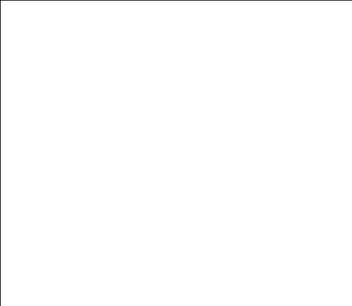
