

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

As a kid I remember looking at my sister and thinking, "No man is ever going to marry her. She is way too...my sister!" I couldn't see her as anything except my goofy, emotional, cooties-laden sister. Years later, on her wedding day, I remember seeing how her husband looked at her, he was totally in love with her, his watery eyes full of overwhelmed joy, drinking in her beauty and grace. He was the one who actually saw her. Blinded by familiarity, I had not been able to see her until now. She was glorious. I finally saw how beautiful my sister really was.

Jesus is transfigured before Peter, James, and John. His face shone like the sun and his clothes dazzle with heavenly light. If it's a miracle, it is so related to the apostles' perception of the glory of Jesus. The physical spectacle reveals how the Father perceives the Son, so to speak: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to him." The Son is always bathed in the Father's love. It's only just now that they finally perceive it.

Who could possibly give his or her heart totally to Jesus? If we perceive him to be just another teacher, symbol, or moral example, we can't. But if the Holy Spirit gives us eyes to see that he is the Beloved Son of God, who makes our humanity not just pleasing to God but filled with glory ... then who can resist him? Perhaps only the lovers are the ones who properly see.

Notes from the Pastor... Fr. Roy Horning

The Church universal hears the St. Matthew's account of the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain. Sadly, the fear of the Lord will be lacking in the hearts of many who hear this proclamation. The biblical meaning of the "fear of the Lord" is literally standing in awe and wonder before God who has revealed himself to us. Most of us will hear the story with "ho hum... Jesus was transfigured". It's important that everyone realize, I'm not condemning or judging hearts, rather I'm looking at the Church (you, me and practically everyone) and recognizing that in our familiarity with the story and our 21st century minds we are missing the awesome grandeur of Matthew's narrative. We all want to believe and see miracles to reassure us in our faith. But, when we hear Jesus do something incredible in the gospels we often simply shrug our shoulders. The majority of people believe what they hear the evangelists tell us, but it lacks the punch of seeing it ourselves; mostly because we have grown over-familiar with the stories. How do we recapture that the awe and wonder of the mystery of God revealing himself to us?

Let me recount a story from several years ago to kind of push us in the direction we all desire to go. Every winter for the past 22 years my classmates, from the seminary, gather together for a week in woods north of Alpena. Sometimes there are 5 of us, and at other times there has been only Fr. Stef and myself; it's always been dependent on our priestly assignments. About ten years ago, Fr. Stef left early in the morning to return back to Covington, Kentucky. He got to Tawas about 6:30AM in the morning and it was still dark. He called me in disbelief: "You won't believe what I just saw. I don't believe what I just saw. Have you ever seen something and you know what it is, but it doesn't belong there? So, you ask yourself, did I just see what I know I saw?" I responded in the affirmative and asked what he saw. He was driving into the northern border of the Tawas industrial/business district when a large cat with a four-foot long tail jumped across the road in front of him. Two jumps and it was on the east side of the road and simply stood there looking at Stef's car as he passed by. "I knew it was a mountain lion! But, my mind couldn't process what I was seeing. It was amazing. Then it went into the woods." I believed him, because he takes walks in the woods for an hour every morning between 5:30 and 7:00AM. He writes down in his journal what he sees: birds, flowers, animals, sunrises, etc. He is by nature and personality an observer of creation and creatures. I share in his awe and wonder of the blessing that morning to this day. Every time I pass that spot, on US-23 North, I ponder Fr. Stef's experience and its reality.

Peter, James and John saw Jesus transfigured before them. They even saw Moses and Elijah conversing with Him. Then the voice from the cloud: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When they heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. Can you imagine the awe and wonder that they experienced and the sense of 'Who am I to see such things?'. And then to hear Jesus tell them, "Rise, and do not be afraid." He then charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead." Who are we to hear such an account? Furthermore, what does it mean for us to believe it? It is the same awe and wonder that we are invited to participate with reverence at the celebration of the Eucharist. Jesus tells us in the consecration, "Do this in memory of me.". We see it with our own eyes and believe that the Bread and Wine has been transformed. The Church teaches us about transubstantiation and the mystery of the Calvary, and we are on our knees in wonder of God's mystery revealed to our minds enlightened by faith. Do we look at the altar when we enter a Catholic Church, and mentally recall what transpires on it during the Holy Mass? All these things really and truly happen...do we allow the mystery to take hold of us and ponder the profound meaning of God's love for us? Jesus did this in order that you and I can know his love, and be transformed by the power of his incarnation, passion, death and resurrection. St. Paul captures the mystery in his words to Timothy: He saved us and called us to a holy life, not according to our works but according to his own design and the grace bestowed on us in Christ Jesus before time began, but now made manifest through the appearance of our savior Christ Jesus, who destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. Let us pray for an increase of faith, hope and charity that we may be witnesses of God's love and mercy in this generation.


