# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great.

Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come.

The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. Of course we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear.

# Notes from the Pastor... Fr. Roy Horning

The 2023 Diocesan Service Appeal (DSA) is in full swing. Last weekend, we heard Bishop Boyea ask for our financial support of the diocesan mission to share the Good News with the people in the ten county Diocese of Lansing. Our contributions are used solely to support the ministries and outreach that the Church does in the name of Jesus to our parishioners and neighbors. There are a vast array of programs that benefit those who might not have any place to turn for assistance, and there is the Catholic Church lending a helping hand. The things that get my immediate attention are the education and formation of young men studying for the priesthood, then I think of Catholic Charities and there many programs to help those in need and those seeking help with mental health and behavioral issues, and finally there are all the diocesan offices that assist parishes with keeping our parish facilities and programs up to date with on-going training and on-site inspections. Many parishes lack the personnel and even lay people with the knowledge and expertise to address all the compliance and safety issues involved with parish operations and facilities. It always makes headlines when someone embezzles money from an organization, especially when it is the Church. The Diocesan Finance Office has been very pro-active in assisting parishes in getting procedures and controls in place to mitigate risks of this happening to us. The same applies to liabilities associated with facilities and maintenance. I admit that sometimes it's a pain, but following their recommendations are very helpful to avoid potential problems. The DSA goals for each parish help the Bishop in his three-fold ministry of sanctifying God's people (providing the sacraments), teaching (formation and evangelization), and governance. Our parish goal is \$38,969 for Holy Rosary and \$34,654 for St. Mary's. I thank you in advance for your generosity and faithfulness to Christ and the mission of the Church.

This weekend, we hear two fascinating stories in the proclamation of the Sacred Scriptures. The first reading is from the Book of Exodus and God supplying his people with water in the desert. The second story is Jesus meeting the Samaritan woman at the well. Both stories remind us that our true need is God, and the eternal life that only he can supply in all its fullness. The event that took place at Massah and Meribah is an amazing miracle of water flowing from the rock that Moses struck with his staff. The people had no water and complained that Moses had brought them into the desert to die of thirst. Moses cried out to Lord (he complained loudly to God!!), "What shall I do with this people?" He was tired and frustrated with their quarreling and complaints; frankly he was fed up with the people and his responsibilities. God told him to strike the rock, and water will flow from it for the people to drink. Moses did as he was instructed, but he did it in anger that was directed at the Israelites. His frustration was so great that he didn't give God the glory. The Book of Numbers (chapter 20) records the same event but adds some important details: Moses said to them, "Listen you rebels, must we bring you water out of this rock?" Then Moses raised his arm and struck the rock twice with his staff. Water gushed out, and the community and their livestock drank. But the Lord said to Moses and Aaron, "Because you did not trust in me enough to honor me as holy in the sight of the Israelites, you will not bring this community into the land I give them." Moses' anger and frustration with the people clouded his judgement and it came with a steep price...he would not enter the Promised Land. He forgot that they were God's people. How often have we forgotten this simple truth with those God has placed under our authority, and acted rashly and not given God the honor and glory for his actions in our lives? The Samaritan woman at the well reminds us that importance of the necessities of life are nothing in comparison to our need for God. Jesus calls the woman and us to deeper faith in the God who provides for all our needs. In humility and gratitude, we are always on for giving the glory to God for his goodness and faithfulness to us. Let us be mindful of this truth as we make our pilgrim journey to the Paschal festivities of Holy Week and our redemption on Calvary.


