Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

God asks a rhetorical and slightly sarcastic question to Samuel, the prophet: "How long will you grieve for Saul, whom I have rejected as king of Israel?" Like us, Samuel is depressed that the old king failed. It's painful to admit that the old regime is done. But God won't let us wallow our pityparty forever. "I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem," announces the Lord, "for I have chosen my king from among his sons." Samuel finally goes and anoints the young David as the new king. And his kingdom is glorious; it's the golden age of Israel's earthly history.

How discouraging to see that my own selfish ego is no longer in charge! How long will I grieve that money, power, pleasure, and reputation have been rejected as the ruler of my life? How wonderful that God has a new future in store for you and me. He is sending us to Bethlehem to anoint the new David as our king. His kingdom won't fail us. He'll slay our goliaths, unite our dispersed energies, and build a Temple where God himself will dwell.

So how long will you grieve? How long?

Notes from the Pastor... Fr. Roy Horning

The men and women who have been preparing, since September, to enter the Church are now in the final period of *Purification and Enlightenment*. The rites belonging to this period are known at the Scrutinies. The entire Church participates in this final stage of preparation. The Church reminds us that the scrutinies are solemnly celebrated on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent and are reinforced by an exorcism in each rite. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good. The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. These rites work to further the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all. This is why the scrutinies involve the congregation in communal prayers on behalf of the catechumens, which is followed by the priest laying hands on the elect and praying a formal prayer of exorcism over them. I share these words from the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults to remind us that sin, the devil, repentance, conversion and redemption in Christ are fundamental tenets of the faith of the Catholic Church. They express the truth about fallen state of man and the love that God has for every man, woman and child. Quite literally in each scrutiny we are seeing the mighty hand of God save a sinner, and we are participants in the salvation of souls. Think about and ponder these words with awe and wonder at the majesty and goodness of the Lord.

I am reading daily meditations from St. Julian of Norwich and want to share with you her burning desire to grow in the spiritual life and love for God. In her twenties she asked for three gifts from God. The first was to understand his Passion; the second was to have an illness in her youth when she was thirty years old; the third was to have, by God's grace, three wounds. She asked for an actual vision of the Lord's Passion—through which she might have a better understanding by being there with Mary, Mary Magdalene and those other friends of Christ who saw his agony and pain at that time. The second petition came to mind as she repented of her sin. She asked for an illness that would bring her so close to death that she and those around her would believe that she in fact dying; however, she asked that her soul not leave her body. Julian asked for this so that she might lose her hold on earthly life and be cleansed by the mercy of God; that afterwards she might live more to his glory because of her illness. She also hoped that by this experience it would ease her eventual death when/if it came, because she would be glad to go to God. She then prayed that these would be granted with a condition, "Lord, you know what desire, but I desire it only if it is your will that I should have it. If it is not your will, good Lord, do not be displeased, for my will is to do your will." The third petition was to receive three wounds in this life. That is, she desired the wound of true repentance, the wound of suffering as Christ suffered, and the wound of seeking God with all my strength. "I made this petition without any condition. The other two desires passed from my mind and the third was with me continually." Julian of Norwich is the story of a fervent soul on fire to know the Lord and conform her life to his. When we think of the purpose of Lent and our spiritual disciplines...her words surely throw gas on the fire.

The 4th Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday, comes from the entrance antiphon "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast." In the Latin both Laetare and Gaudete are both used in this antiphon. Gaudete means an expressed and exuberant joy. Laetare means an internal joy, a joy of anticipation that we feel within this solemn season of Lent. Indeed, as we look forward to Holy Week and the celebration of Easter Sunday we ought to be experiencing both types of joy. Let us pray that Jesus will heal our spiritual eyes like those of the man born blind, that we may see and fully understand all that God has done for us in the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. May we be steadfast in our Lenten resolutions in preparation for the paschal festivities.
