Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What's your car? Let's say it's a fancy silver Toyota. Now imagine you're having lunch in a restaurant and suddenly see two men outside attempting to steal it. You run outside and confront them. They respond, "The master has need of it." How do you respond? Would you just let them take it, and leave you without a car? I don't think I would.

Yet that is precisely what the owners of the colt on Palm Sunday do. Stunningly, and perhaps a little comically, Jesus instructs two of his disciples to commandeer a colt for him to ride. And when they hear the disciples say, **"The master has need of it,"** they let them take it. Of course, Jesus knew they'd let it go. He gave them the grace to let go of what is rightfully theirs. The result? That colt became perhaps the most famous and important animal ever. The beast plays a role in the redemption of the world.

As Holy Week begins, Jesus perhaps will send people to you to ask for something valuable to you. Perhaps it's your car. More likely it's something like your attention, time, or energy. It's natural to resist at first. We've got things to do, after all. But if the interruption is from Jesus himself, listen to that voice which calmly says, **"The master has need of it."** And simply let it go. You'll be amazed what the master will do with it.




Notes from the Pastor... Fr. Roy Horníng

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week and the celebration of our redemption in Christ Jesus. Holy Week begins with the triumphal entrance of Jesus into the holy city, Jerusalem. The crowds welcomed him with "*Hosanna, to Son of David*" and spreading their cloaks and palms upon the road as he road the rode upon the donkey. This fulfilled the words of the prophet Zechariah, "*Say to the Daughter of Zion, 'See, your king comes to you, gentle and riding a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey'*." The gospel for Palm Sunday is always the proclamation of the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is quite jarring following the proclamation of the Triumphal Entry before the procession with palms at the beginning of Mass; but today's Mass recognizes that Jesus' real triumph, glory, and kingship is when he his lifted up on the Cross. Our experience in life is like that of our Lord whom we follow; Jesus was loved and hated, he was welcomed and rejected, and he suffered the injustices of this fallen world. He willingly embraced the things we would rather avoid, even unto death to redeem and save us. Jesus promised that if we place all our trust and hope in him, we too will share in his victory over sin and death. It seems rather fitting and right that we end the Octave of Easter (the first week of Easter) with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday.

Pope John Paul II declared that the Second Sunday of Easter would be designated Divine Mercy Sunday in the Roman Calendar, when he canonized Sister Faustina Kowalski on April 30, 2000. On April 22, 2001, which was one year after establishing Divine Mercy Sunday, Pope John Paul II reemphasized its message within the resurrection hope of Easter. He stated: "Jesus said to St. Faustina one day: 'Humanity will never find peace until it turns with trust to Divine Mercy.' Divine Mercy! This is the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity." The devotion of the Divine Mercy grew rapidly after its designation and promotion by JPII and is now widely celebrated by Catholics around the world. I was ordained in 2001 and had knew very little if anything about the devotion; but now 21 years later I regularly give the Divine Mercy Chaplet as a penance and people know it. Frequently, I hear "Father, I pray that it every day!". The Divine Mercy image of Jesus and the words "Jesus, I trust in you" captures the hope of every believer. We trust in His infinite love for his creatures revealed in his Passion, Death and Resurrection. He died our death, in order that we might share in his life. The Divine Mercy Devotion will be celebrated at Holy Rosary on April 16th. It will begin with Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament following the Sunday 9AM Mass. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be celebrated from Noon until 3PM. At 3PM the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be recited, followed by Benediction. All are invited to participate, and if you are going to pray a Novena you would start by reciting the chaplet each day beginning on Good Friday. There is the opportunity for a plenary indulgence attached to the Divine Mercy Devotion; you would need to venerate the Divine Mercy image, receive Holy Communion, make a good confession and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, Pope Francis.

The Masses and services for Holy Week are as follows: Holy Rosary and St. Mary's will celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7PM on Thursday. Good Friday, or The Friday of the Passion of the Lord will begin at 1PM. Stations of the Cross will be prayed at both parishes beginning at 12:15PM. Holy Rosary will also have Stations of the Cross at 6PM for those who were unable to attend the Lord's Passion during the afternoon. <u>The Great Easter Vigil will only be celebrated at Holy Rosary this year</u> and will begin at 8:30PM. Easter Sunday Masses will follow the regular Sunday schedule: St. Mary's at 7:30AM and 11AM, and Holy Rosary at 9AM. I wish everyone a fruitful and grace-filled Holy Week!


