

#### TRAVEL/TRIP INFORMATION:

- To register, please call the Mahany/Meininger Senior Community Center, Monday-Friday from 9:00 am - 4:30 pm or go to <u>royaloakrec.com</u> (some day/extended trips are not available to register online; must register with a staff person).

We cannot process any monetary transactions until Thursday, July 1, 2021. This affects only <u>Day Trips</u>. Deposits for <u>Extended trips</u> go directly to each Travel Agent, so we CAN accept those registrations.

- Don't wait to sign up for trips—they may be cancelled for lack of participation.
- Arrive 15-30 minutes ahead of departure time.
- Park in the North end of the parking lot by the "Trip Parking" signs. Trips sponsored by Bianco Tours and Rybicki Tours will check you in as you board the motor coach. No need to enter the building! However, some trips may be subject to check-in with Center staff personnel upon arrival—your receipt will tell you where check-in will be.
- Trip itineraries are subject to change without notice. Sometimes the venues surprise us! IMPORTANT- CANCELLATION POLICY:
- If you cancel, refunds will be issued if we are able to fill your space.

Are you new to the Royal Oak Transportation Service we offer?

Or do you need a refresher on the current rules for using this service?

- -Vans and bus rides are \$3 for a one way and \$4 for a round trip
- We operate Monday Friday
- -Call 248-246-3914 two weeks in advance to book
- Riders and Drivers are still wearing masks no matter if you are vaccinated or not
- Our service falls under Federal Law; no exceptions to masking rule.
- Riders must be able to transport own bags and items
- Drivers take the temperature and ask health questions of each rider
- Max 3 riders on a bus
- Only one rider on the van
- Drivers sanitize and clean interior of bus after each passenger exits
- Still observing social distancing seating on bus.
- \*These modified rules are in place from now until September\*





## TED\* Talks


The Royal Oak Senior Center is interested in beginning a new program, called "TED Talks" on a regular weekly or bi-monthly basis.

## Supportive Services



**R.O.S.E.S.** is a program providing a variety of portive services to Royal Oak residents age 62 and over and qualify for subsidy. You must live in your own home alone, with a spouse, or with a disabled adult child. Seniors living with able-bodied adult children do not qualify for the subsidy assistance. To ascertain household income, please provide your name, most recent Home Heating Credit or Michigan Homestead Property Tax Credit form. If you live in one of the senior high rises, you will need to provide: The HUD Tenant Eligibility & Rent Procedures form.

The following subsidy scale will apply as of July 1, 2021:

The City of Royal Oak sponsors this service. Please call **248-246-3900 Monday-Friday** for more assistance.

**Home Chores** - Household tasks such as yardwork, housework, and gutter (first level only) cleaning are available. No windows, weeding, wall washing or roofing.

**Home Repair** - Repairs that do not require a licensed contractor are available to homeowners. Repairs including minor plumbing, carpentry and minor electrical. No roofing.

**Personal Home Care** - Includes assistance with activities of daily living; bathing, meals, shampoos, dressing and help with ambulating. Personal aides cannot handle incontinent clients and are not trained to clean up bodily fluids. NO pill sorting or dispensing medication.

**No Pet Care**. We do not clean up after pets, walk or handle feedings.

## Meaningful Activity and Ideas for People Living with Alzheimer's Disease

Sensory Stimulation Therapy (sst)

Originally used as a therapy in Europe, sensory stimulation has gained prominence in the United States as a treatment for Alzheimer's disease. (Wegerer, 2017)

Alzheimer's disease creates anxiety and stress, and those living with AD become more sensitive to their physical & social environments and rely more on their senses for cues about what is going on around them. By using everyday household objects, caregivers can help those with Alzheimer's feel engaged, encourage self-expression & stir memories of an emotional connection. Giving these seniors the means to express themselves, when they can no longer do so with words, helps them feel safe and relaxed. Other benefits from SST activity are helping with anxiety, elevating mood, and building self- esteem. Here are some meaningful activities that incorporate sst:-Arrange fresh or artificial flowers.

- -Paint small wooden boards and/ or fit together PVC pipes. \*\*Great idea for tinkers & Seniors with High Motor functions.
- -Senior helps prepare snacks, pulling grapes off stems and placing in snack bags is a manageable and useful task.
- -Tie <u>loose</u> knots along a thick rope, Senior may enjoy untying them.
- -Sort buttons, bolts, coins, or silverware.
- -Give small jobs, wipe doorknobs or wash eye glasses. Reminisce with them about their hometown. Print out maps, with detail of familiar landmarks and street names, of Mom/ Dad's hometown from google maps https://www.google.com/maps
- -Holding old keys or delicate fabrics can evoke memories. Even if your loved one does not remember their first car or wedding, the feeling of weighty keys or embroidered veil could encourage reminiscence.

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
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
