


This year is flying by!!

Summer is here and the weather is heating up! Just like the weather, the Clerk's office is also heating up with preparations well under way for the August Primary. All of our Election Inspectors have attended training and are now certified for the next 2 years. We have also printed and mailed Absent Voter Ballot Applications to all voters designated as a permanent absentee voter. If you have not received your application, please contact the Township Clerk's office at 810-686-7580.

This year the Absent Voter Ballot Application is a dual application, meaning it is good for both the August Primary and the November General Elections. At the top of the application you must check which election you would like a ballot for, it can be for one election or both, sign and date in Section 1 and return to the Clerk's office either by dropping it off in person, emailing or by U.S. Mail. Section 2 should only be filled out if you will be out of town during either of the elections. A good example of this are the residents that go to Florida for the winter. In this case you would fill out the address where you would like the ballot sent and the date you leave your primary address and the date you will return, the U.S. Post Office **will not** forward your ballot, so this section is very important.

Absentee Voter Ballots for the August Primary should be arriving at your mail boxes near the end of June. When you vote your ballot, remember there is no crossover voting for this election, which means you have to vote all one party for all partisan offices. Make sure you put your ballot back in the secrecy sleeve that it comes in and then in the return envelope provided. Do not tear off the numbered stub and make sure you sign and date the outside envelope and seal it up. Your ballot can be dropped off at the Township, either in person, in the black ballot drop box located outside by the parking lot, the drop box located at the front doors on the east side of the building or by US Mail. Ballots must be returned to the Township by Tuesday, August 2, 2022 by 8:00 pm to be counted. Postmarks do not count.

Due to the redistricting which occurred in our State, all registered voters will also receive a new Voter I.D. card in the mail. This card is informational only and is not needed to vote. It provides you with your district numbers for US Congressional, State Senate and State Representative, County Commissioner and your School District. The district numbers will allow you an easier time to research the candidates running for office in your area. If you receive a Voter I.D. card that is the wrong address or for a person that no longer lives there, please return these to the Clerk's office so we can adjust our voter file or get them to the correct voter.

If you are not registered to vote and wish to, you can easily register 3 ways: You can register at any Secretary of State office, register online at <u>www.michigan.gov/sos</u> or come to the Township office.

I've given you a lot of information in this article, but, if I haven't covered something that you have a question on, please don't hesitate to call the Clerk's office at 810-686-7580.

Remember the polls are open from 7:00 am – 8:00 pm on Tuesday, August 2, 2022 at the Clio Area Senior Center, 2136 W. Vienna Road.

If you're looking to escape the heat, check out the Clio Area Library for summer reading programs, events and trips with the Clio Senior Center or take a class with the Clio Center for the Arts.

If you find yourself doing some summer cleaning, you can purchase 30-gallon, heavy duty trash bags (\$25.00 for 100ct box) and recycle bins (\$6.00 each) at the Township office.

Genesee County Recycling Days will be held at Carman-Ainsworth Middle School (1409 W. Maple Ave., Flint, MI 48507) to collect household hazardous waste, electronics and paint on: Tuesday, July 19th (2pm-6pm) and Tuesday, August 23rd (2pm-6pm)

Items accepted at Recycle Day: Aerosols, automotive fluids, batteries (household/auto), biomedical sharps in rigid/sealed containers, corrosives (acids/bases), electronics (all kinds), fire extinguishers, fluorescent bulbs & tubes, mercury, oil-based paint & solvents, pesticides & herbicides, prescription medications, propane cylinders (up to 30lbs. each), reactives & oxidizers, and smoke detectors. Summer 2022 Tax Statements will be mailed out July 1st. If you have not received a statement for your property, please contact the Vienna Township office as soon as possible.

The deadline for summer tax payment is September 14, 2022. Payment must be received by the due date. Postmarks are not accepted.

Ways to Pay:

- Check & Money Orders are accepted at Vienna Township Hall, drop box and by mail.
- Cash Payments may be made at Independent Bank Clio Branch (3500 W. Vienna Road, Clio).
- Online Payments can be made at <u>www.viennatwp.com</u>. A convenience fee (3%) will be charged for credit/debit card payments and a \$1.50 fee for ACH payments.

Vienna Township accepts partial payments, without interest, until the tax payment deadline of September 14, 2022.

If summer taxes are not paid in full by September 14th, there will be a 1% penalty charge applied on the balance owed. An additional 1% penalty charge will be applied each month that the taxes remain unpaid, until March 1, 2023 when they are sent to the Genesee County Treasurer for collection.

I hope everyone is enjoying their Summer. While you're enjoying the nice weather, please keep these few tips in mind as you do. If building campfires, keep them at least 25 feet away from tents, shrubs and anything that can burn. Use propane, charcoal, and wood pellet barbecue grills outdoors only. If you want to see fireworks, go to a public show put on by experts. Most fire deaths happen overnight, and a closed bedroom door can slow the spread of flames and reduce smoke inhalation that could save your life. We ask that you check your smoke alarms every month, working smoke alarms provide you with the best chance of escaping a fire. If you're in need of a smoke alarm, please contact Clio Fire Station 1 at (810) 687-8506.

Please remember to call our Burn line number prior to doing any outdoor burning, that number is (810) 686-5432 and as always, burning of leaves and building material is NOT allowed.

The Clio Fire Dept is not only accepting applications for Firefighters but anyone that could aid with other task around the Stations, please visit our website or Fire Stations for more information.

STORAGE OF ANY RECREATIONAL EQUIPMENT OR TRAILERS:

No recreational equipment or trailer shall be parked or stored on any lot in a residential district except in a garage or carport or beyond the nearest portion of a building to a street; provided, however, that such equipment may be parked anywhere on the residential premises for not to exceed 24 hours during loading or unloading. No such equipment shall be used for living, sleeping or housekeeping purposes when parked or stored on a residential lot, or any location not approved for such use.

The weather is getting warmer and people are out and about, please be cautious of motorcycles, bicycles, and pedestrians when you are driving.

Remember to contact 911 if you see anything suspicious in and around your neighborhood. With the warmer weather we normally see a rise in the number of larcenies from vehicles and vandalism. Deputies patrol Vienna Township 24 hours a day and contacting 911 is the most efficient method to report any issues.

We have had some residents inquire about the speed limits on unposted roadways. Remember all unposted roadways are 55 MPH unless otherwise posted. The exception to this would be residential subdivisions and mobile home parks. The speed limit on a roadway within a residential subdivision is 25 MPH and the speed limit within the boundaries of a mobile home park is 15 MPH. Please do not park on the road or block traffic when doing any kind of lawn maintenance, landscaping and such. Have a safe and great summer.

In order to comply with Michigan State Tax Commission recommendations, the Vienna Township Assessment department will be reviewing 20% of the parcels located within Vienna Township each year. Kevin MacDermaid and/ or Ryan MacDermaid will be conducting physical inspections of properties in the Township. This includes measuring the exterior of the house and other structures on the property, taking pictures and interviewing owners to obtain interior characteristics of the structures. At no time will we request to enter your house or any buildings on your property. We will be displaying Vienna Township ID badges. You may also request to view our Michigan Driver's License to aid in identification. Please direct any questions or concerns to the Vienna Township Office.

Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) is designed for those who need extra help to live safely in their home. If someone "55 or better" is struggling physically, with their memory or an unstable health condition, they may be eligible for services through PACE.

To enroll, someone must be:

- Age 55 or older
- Living in a zip code served by PACE
- Certified as meeting Michigan criteria for nursing home level of care*
- Able to live safely in their home with the support of PACE* *Determined by the PACE Intake Team.

Ascension Living PACE Michigan expanded our service area.

We now serve ZIP codes in Genesee, Lapeer, Tuscola, Shiawassee and Livingston counties.

The Vienna Township BDA is moving to a new location at 3420 West Vienna Road soon. Renovations are being made to transform the building into an administrative office space for BDA staff.

The BDA Board of Directors has awarded approximately \$80,000 in exterior property improvement grants to several businesses along Saginaw Road. This is a pilot pro-

ject that will continue in 2023 and beyond and will expand to include other parts of the BDA district.
