HAIL, HOLY QUEEN - Dcn. Dennis Walters -



WENTY-SOME YEARS AGO, Rev. Alex Jones, then pastor of Maranatha Pentecostal Church in Detroit, was conducting a series of teachings for his African-American congregation about how the early Church worshiped. As part of that series, he asked me to explain the Rosary to his Wednesday night study group.

My talk went into the history of the Rosary, then into the mysteries, and then the prayers: the Our Father (which they knew), the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be (both of which were unfamiliar). I explained why the words of the Hail Mary call her "Mother of God," namely, that if Jesus as a person is both human and divine, and Mary is his mother, it's only appropriate to call her "Mother of God" - which is exactly what early Christians called her. That was the easy

But when I came to the concluding prayer, the Hail Holy Queen, I realized that the words of that prayer presented a challenge: how to avoid creating the impression that Mary usurps the saving role of her Son. So, going through the prayer line by line, here is a summary of what I told them.

part my talk.

"Hail, Holy Queen." Mary's queenship is not obvious to most Christians. To them, she was a simple country girl who happened to be chosen as the mother of the Savior. Yet that

choice conferred royalty upon her. The angel Gabriel told Mary that her son would be given the throne of his father David, and that he would reign forever (Luke 1:32-33). Thus, Jesus would be a king. With a modern king, his wife would usually be the queen; but in ancient

Israelite monarchies when kings had many wives, the king's mother would be queen. As both mother and queen, she had enormous intercessory influence with her son (see 1 Kings 2:19-20). Mary is every inch a queen.

> "Mother of Mercy." Here, the prayer uses a figure of speech called *metonymy*, substituting one noun for another without changing the basic meaning. For example, instead of saying, "John talks a lot," I might say, "John's all mouth." The figure makes the idea bolder, more forceful. In the same way, this prayer substitutes the name of a virtue for a person. Mary is the mother of Jesus; Jesus, being God incarnate, is the embodiment of mercy; so, figuratively, Mary is mother of Mercy. —continued on p. 2 > 3

"Our life, our sweetness, and our hope" – another example of the same type of figure. As a mother, Mary conceives life in her womb and delivers it to the world. Jesus called himself the way, the truth, and the life. In bearing him, Mary gives birth to Life itself, since God is Life. From the earliest years of the Church, icons have shown Mary holding the child Jesus out to us for our adoration. In presenting him to us, she presents us with the Life that he is. That Life is the source of hope for us who desire eternal life. These icons show Mary in her role as a mediator, not the source of our life or our hope but the one who brings these realities to us.

"To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve." We appeal to the sinless Oueen because our nature has inherited the sin of Adam and Eve that banishes us from the Garden of Eden. We can't return there on our own. We look to our Queen for help.

"To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears." It often surprises me how many Catholics have trouble with this part of the prayer. While this life contains many occasions for joy and happiness, it also carries with it times of sadness and much misery. Love for this life should not obscure the mourning that attends loss, tragedy, pain, sickness, and death. It's on occasions of sadness that we appeal to Mary.

"Most gracious advocate." According to the Catechism, Mary "by her manifold intercession continues to bring us the gifts of eternal salvation.... Therefore the Blessed Virgin is invoked in the Church under the titles of Advocate, Helper, Benefactress, and Mediatrix" (CCC 969). She pleads on our behalf before the Father, as Queen Bathsheba did in presenting petitions to Solomon or as Queen Esther did to save her people from genocide. Being an advocate, Mary also communicates to us the graces that she obtains from the Father. And so we pray:

"Turn thine eyes of mercy toward us." The oldest Marian prayer we have comes from a third century Egyptian plea for her help. The language is much like that of the Memorare: "Under your mercy we take refuge, O Mother of God. Do not reject our supplications in our necessity, but deliver us from danger, [O you] alone pure and most blessed." As Queen, Mary's gaze is one of mercy toward her children.

"Show unto us the fruit of thy womb, O Clement, O Loving, O Sweet Virgin Mary." As in the Hail Mary, "fruit of thy womb' is a picturesque way of saying, Show us your child, Jesus. Clement is just an old-fashioned word for merciful.

As I told the Maranatha study group, this is a prayer rich in imagery, but one that makes a simple request: Though you are a sinless Queen, Mary, you know our condition, because you lived through it yourself. Bring us to your Son, and your Son to us. This prayer ends the Rosary and is a fitting one to end the day with; it's often sung in Latin as part of night prayer. †
