NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Isaiah 35:4-7 This section of the book of Isaiah contains the words of a prophet to God's people exiled in Babylon. He encourages them that one day they will be free to return home to Jerusalem. This journey will be through the desert, but God will transform this barren wasteland to ease their passage home.

James 2:1-5 The letter of James was written approximately 50 years after the death and resurrection of Jesus. It was addressed not to a particular community, but to Christians everywhere. Because of this, it is a part of a group of new Testament letters called catholic – that is, universal – epistles. One of the trademarks of the epistle of James is the need to act on God's word, not just listen to it.

Mark 7:31-37 Mark demonstrates that the early Christian community delighted in seeing the ministry of Jesus as a fulfillment of ancient prophecies from Israel's history. In today's miracle story, there is a specific reference to Isaiah's prophecy in the first Reading. The miracle here found only in the gospel of Mark, stresses the physical actions that accompany the healing. Mark shows Jesus more as a wonder-worker whose true identity will become clear in His resurrection.

Reflect: Do you ever speak on behalf of those who have no voice or are not heard?

FROM FR. PAUL

Dear brothers and sisters,

The first reading from this weekend has one of my favorite lines in the entire Old Testament. Moses, as he is instructing the people in the commandments of God, asks the question, “*For what great nation is there that has gods so close to it as the Lord, our God, is to us whenever we call upon him?*” (Dt. 4:7) This is clearly a rhetorical question, there is no other nation before Israel that has God Himself so close by. But this passage always makes me reflect on just how amazing the coming of Jesus actually is. God dwells with Israel in a pillar of fire and smoke, the closest God has ever been to humanity since Adam and Eve. But now, in the New Covenant God dwells with us as one of us. In the person of Christ, God becomes man.

As we have been reflecting for weeks on the Eucharist, the closeness of God is even more astounding. God came to be with us. He came as one of us. He lived a human life and died a human death. But in this era of the resurrection, He gives Himself to us in a way that we could never have even thought to ask or imagine. He comes to literally dwell inside of us, an intimacy that knows no separation. So when God feels distant, let us run to the Eucharistic Lord. Let us always open our hearts and hands to Him, for what great nation is there that has gods so close to it as the Lord, our God, is to us whenever we call upon Him?


Blood Drive Leadership Transition

MORNING BIBLE STUDY FOR MEN AND WOMEN





MEN'S FAITH & FELLOWSHIP


"The Year of St. Joseph"

Make the Ignatian Spiritual Exercises



If you always imagine God in the same way, no matter how true and beautiful it may be, you will not be able to receive the gift of the new ways He has ready for you.

The Ignatian Spiritual Exercises is a pilgrimage of a spiritual search for the fulfillment of a desire for holiness. The exercise experience is about praying, searching, exploring and discovering; it is a journey with God. Christ Jesus is your companion as you learn to walk the life journey path as Jesus asks: *“What are you looking for?”* (Jn 1:38) and *“Come and see.”* (Jn 1:39). Those who engage in the Spiritual Exercises discover a response to *“What is God asking of me?”* The Exercise experience is good for increasing openness to the movement of the Holy Spirit strengthening and supporting you in the effort **to respond ever more faithfully to the love of God.**

The full Spiritual Exercises may be done in the midst of ordinary daily life at home. It involves a daily commitment of 45-60 minutes in prayer and reflection centered on the themes of the Exercises and a weekly meeting with Linda Chevalier, Spiritual Director/ Companion for approximately eight or nine months. Linda will meet with you on a weekly basis at her home which allows for reflective conversation and confidentiality. The cost for the Spiritual Exercises is to offer a stipend, payable over the course of the retreat. You will have a discussion about the precise details during your first conversation.
