NEXT SUNDAY'S READINGS

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Numbers 11:25-29 The book of Numbers describes the wanderings of the Jewish people in the Sinai Desert. Earlier in the book, Moses had complained to God about the difficulties in governing so many people. In response, God had directed Moses to gather 70 elders around the meeting tent to receive a share in the administrative burdens. Today's passage picks up from there.

James 5:1-6 Today we conclude our series of five readings from the letter of James. A major concern in this letter is social justice. Today, the author delivers a blistering attack, reminiscent of some Old Testament prophets.

Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48 There are 3 messages in this brief passage. 1) No one can lay exclusive claim to the reign of God as revealed in Christ; it is there for the taking. 2) Even the simplest disciple shares the inestimable dignity of divine life and those who would lead them astray will have the harshest kind of judgment. 3) It is very important to enter the reign of God no matter what the cost.

Reflect: Who is God for you? What opportunities do you have to promote or explain your faith?

FROM FR. PAUL

Dear brothers and sisters,

The Gospels are full of different paradoxes, and Jesus gives us one of the biggest in our Gospel today. He says, "*If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all.*" This statement leaves us with two important questions: What does that mean and how is that possible?

First, it means the worldly view of positioning and power is exactly backwards. They will tell you wealth, dominance, and influence will get you ahead, but all of that is fleeting and passing away. At some point everyone will stand before God empty-handed. But while our hands must be empty, our hearts will not be so. We get to bring with us all that is stored in the heart, those things that consist of faith, hope, and love. One who is rich in this way is what Jesus means when He speaks of the last one becoming the first.

With this understanding, the second question becomes easier to answer, but not always easy to carry out. To live this way only becomes possible as I exercise the graces God has given to me. It becomes possible when I actually decide to love my enemy, to forgive those who wrong me, to give to the poor, to take up my cross everyday, and most importantly, when I decide to love God with my entire heart, soul, mind, and strength. Together then, let us outdo one another in trying to be last in worldly standards, that we might be first among the Saints.
