



Pastoral Perspective

COVIDSAFE church

About ten days ago, the CDC announced new guidelines regarding masking and social distancing for vaccinated persons. This has left many of us, vaccinated and unvaccinated alike, unsure about when and where we should mask or social distance, and what the rules are, especially in social settings involving a lot of people. While the risk has been significantly diminished, there is still increased danger of spreading or contracting Covid-19 in large indoor gatherings (like mass), and a risk (though small) to children who are not yet able to be vaccinated. Thus, we at St. Mary feel it premature to immediately relax *all* the safety guidelines that we have been following, but we will be slowly making changes. As has been the case throughout the pandemic, we know that some members of our community will think we are still being too careful, and others will think we are relaxing things too quickly. We ask your patience as we slowly “open up” and take steps in the spirit of the CDC guidelines, while also doing our best to make sure that as many people as possible feel comfortable and safe worshiping with us. Also, despite these new guidelines, we ask all members of our community to respect and accommodate the many who will still choose to wear a mask and social distance.

BEGINNING MAY 22:

Those who are fully vaccinated are not required to wear masks. We ask others to continue to do so until fully vaccinated.

For the comfort of other parishioners, we ask that you continue to social distance, but you may do so by household or by safe social circles which you have established with family, friends or neighbors.

We will return to communion distribution at the normal time (rather than at the conclusion of mass). The priest or Eucharistic minister will go to the end of each row, and invite you forward one row at a time, to reduce the amount of movement required.

We will continue to ask that there be no congregational singing during mass.

BEGINNING MAY 29:

For those who would still prefer to attend a Sunday mass in which masking and social distancing by household will be required, especially out of concern for our children’s safety, **we will continue to practice masking and social distancing at the Sunday 10:00 am and the 2pm mass.** This means that masks are required for all.

With the exception of the Sunday 10:00 am mass, sign-ups in advance will no longer be required.

With the dispensation from the Sunday obligation no longer in effect, we are anticipating the possibility of larger numbers of people at mass. With that in mind, we will also be opening Donnelly Hall for additional seating, with the same safety precautions.


We hope that it won’t be long before we can relax things even further and begin to return to a more familiar worship experience. We thank you for your patience as we take this first step in that direction.

IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS—HAPPY 500TH, ST. IGNATIUS!



This month (and year) is important to the Society of Jesus, and those in Jesuit circles (yes, that means us)! It was 500 years ago that the founder of the Jesuits, St. Ignatius of Loyola, was injured by a cannonball that shattered both of his legs in a battle. He was a soldier at the time and the injury would change his life forever. Ignatius discovered during his long recovery period that he had a strong attraction for spiritual things that were leading him closer to God.

He paid attention to how he was feeling about these spiritual discoveries and realized this path toward God was now the one he wanted to keep following.

The rest is history, but over the ensuing years, Ignatius wrote down some important ideas about following and paying attention to God. Thankfully, the Jesuits have shared and taught these principles and practices, including the retreat meditations called “The Spiritual Exercises.”

As a Jesuit-run parish, we at St. Mary Student Parish want to do more to share these teachings with our community. Since this is designated “An Ignatian Year,” we plan to

dedicate some space in each Sunday bulletin (and on our parish website), called “In the Spirit of Ignatius.” Throughout the year, we hope to include articles, prayers, and principles of Ignatian Spirituality.

Understanding our faith the way St. Ignatius suggests can help us to live with greater freedom, and in closer friendship with Jesus.

For tutors, no language or teaching experience is required - just an interest in helping others practice English! All levels of English learners are welcome, and the program is free.



INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. Currently, baptisms are held privately due to Covid.

Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

Baptism preparation class is arranged by emailing Deacon Romolo Leone rleone@umich.edu or calling 734-663-0557 ext 233. Masks and proper social distancing is required. If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.

During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

- **PARISHIONERS AND STUDENTS CAN SIT TOGETHER IN HOUSE-HOLD GROUPS WHEN ATTENDING MASS HERE.** Proper social distancing is still important so we ask everyone to please follow these instructions.
- Chairs are arranged in rows of 8 on each side of the main aisle with shorter rows on the sides of the altar.
- **SEATS ARE FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE. WHEN CHOOSING YOUR SEATS THERE MUST BE 4 EMPTY SEATS BETWEEN YOU AND ANYONE ELSE IN THE SAME ROW.**
- Mass will still end with Communion. Follow the celebrant's instructions for receiving Communion.
- Masks are required to be worn during the entire Mass and must cover both your nose and mouth.
- Reservations will be limited to registered parishioners and students.
- Seating will be about 70 individual chairs.
- We strongly discourage those with compromised immune systems from attending mass.






