Pastoral Perspective

DISCOVER THE PRESENCE OF GOD IN ALL THING

With immense joy and gratitude, I have begun a two-year assignment here at St. Mary Student Parish just a few weeks after being ordained a Jesuit priest on June 12th in Milwaukee! As I priest, I've had the privilege to celebrate masses in diverse settings including St. Patrick's Cathedral in NYC, Dorothy Day's original Catholic Worker house, the Agape Community Catholic farm, UofD Jesuit High (my alma mater), my parents' living room, and in both Spanish and English here at St. Mary! I am very excited to get to know each of you and to engage in many of the wonderful programs here in the parish and in the Newman Center.

This year, in addition to the annual St. Ignatius Feast Day on July 31st, we are celebrating the 500 year anniversary of St. Ignatius' conversion. In 1521, after being struck by a cannonball on his knee, the 26 year-old Íñigo de Loyola endured numerous surgeries to reset his leg (without anesthesia!). Although he requested romance novels and wartime books, the only books available to him were the Life of Christ and a book about the saints. He began to realize his deepest desires and his relationship with God after reading these two books, leading Ignatius to leave behind his past life and to set out on a pilgrimage across Spain. Over the next twenty years, Ignatius wrote the Spiritual Exercises, received a formal education, formed a community of his First Companions, and founded the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1540.

Ignatius, along with his companions, left a lasting legacy that is more widespread today than ever before. The variety of Jesuit ministries around the world includes schools, retreat centers, social ministries, and parishes such as St. Mary Student Parish! Subsequently, many of us have cultivated transformative experiences in Ignatian spirituality which gives us a common language to talk about our moments of finding God in all things, discerning our interior movements, and embodying a faith that does justice. I am deeply grateful for this global Jesuit community and for this spirituality which has helped me realize my deepest desires and has brought me here to St. Mary Student Parish! What does Ignatian spirituality mean to you and how has it shaped your life?

As we celebrate the feast day of St. Ignatius of Loyola and the Ignatian Year, may his life and his example continue to be a source of inspiration and blessing for all of us. May the wisdom of his Spiritual Exercises be a source of guidance as we continue our pilgrimage towards union with God. And like Ignatius on the banks of the Cardoner river, may we each come to consciously discover the presence of God in all things, drawing us to an ever deeper companionship with Jesus and our community of creation.

Give us the grace to work for reconciliation every day: with you, with others and with your creation. Open our eyes so we might see all things new in Christ.

Daily devotion to Mary

Our Blessed Mother played an important role in the life and beliefs of St. Ignatius. Just as we often turn to her to intercede for us, Ignatius honored and relied on her in many ways. One of these is a way of praying called the “Triple Colloquy.”

As people journey through the Spiritual Exercises (created by Ignatius and carried on by Jesuit leaders today) they are asked to close out their meditation time by imagining they are sharing their thoughts with God, Jesus and Mary. It’s like a conversation with three friends. As we pray, we remain open to whatever thoughts, feelings or comfort they want to send us.


VIRTUAL ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

BAPTISM CLASS

Baptism preparation class is required to be taken for your first child. If you've taken the class elsewhere, proof of that will be necessary to schedule a baptism. Classes are on Monday 6:30-7:30 PM.

Class dates through 2021 are as follows:
8/2, 9/12, 10/4, 11/1 and 12/6.

If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.

During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.




