

CELEBRATING LIFE

Hi! My name is Aissa Cabrales and I am a senior at the University of Michigan and am the Latino/Hispanic Ministry Intern. Day of the Dead is an annual Mexican celebration that takes place on October 31st, November 1st, and

November 2nd, a period in which we celebrate, remember, and honor our loved ones. Even though this celebration is strongly linked to Mexican traditions, Day of the Dead is widely celebrated throughout Central and South America as well.

Being first-generation born here in the United States, my experience of Día de los Muertos is a little bit different as some of the traditional customs had to be adapted to living in the United States. Most families usually go to the cemetery and decorate the graves of their loved ones and create ofrendas (altars). In my family's case, the majority of our loved ones that have passed are in Mexico and because of being unable to travel back to Mexico, we are only able to put up pictures in our living room with their favorite candy, food, and drinks with a candle lit, oftentimes followed with a rosary.

To us, we believe that their souls visit us every year. While my family's experience of celebrating Day of the Dead is not in any sense traditional or representative of other families, we all share the same belief that we are celebrating life. Day of the Dead reminds us all that we don't just celebrate the people we love while they are here on Earth, we celebrate the life and legacy they left behind. Day of the Dead is a celebration of who our loved ones were, their beautiful souls, and how they changed our lives.

¡Hola! Mi nombre es Aissa Cabrales y soy un estudiante en mi último año en la Universidad de Michigan y soy la Interna del Ministerio Hispano/Latino. El Día de Muertos es una celebración mexicana anual que se celebra el 31 de octubre, el 1 de noviembre y el 2 de noviembre, un período en el que celebramos, recordamos y honramos a nuestros familiares difuntos. Aunque esta celebración está fuertemente vinculada a las tradiciones mexicanas, el Día de Muertos también se celebra en Centro y Sudamérica. Siendo primera generación nacida aquí en los Estados Unidos, mi experiencia del Día de los Muertos es un poco diferente ya que algunas de las costumbres tradicionales tuvieron que adaptarse a vivir en los Estados Unidos. La mayoría de las familias suelen ir al cementerio y decorar las tumbas de sus seres queridos y crear ofrendas. En el caso de mi familia, la mayoría de nuestros seres queridos que han fallecido están enterrados en México y al no poder viajar a México, solo podemos poner fotos en nuestra sala con sus dulces favoritos, comida y bebida con una vela encendida y rezar un rosario. Para nosotros, creemos que sus almas nos visitan cada año. Aunque la experiencia de cómo mi familia celebra Día de Muertos no es representante de todas las familias que lo celebran, todos compartimos la misma creencia de que estamos celebrando la vida de nuestros seres queridos. El Día de los Muertos nos recuerda a todos que no solo celebramos a las personas que amamos mientras están aquí en la tierra, celebramos la vida y el legado que dejaron. El Día de los Muertos es una celebración de quiénes eran nuestros seres queridos, sus hermosas almas y cómo cambiaron nuestras vidas.

“INTERNATIONAL” SUCCESS

Thank you, everyone, for your generosity and enthusiasm last Saturday morning! Twenty-two folks (ages 4 to 70+ years) showed up to walk and/or run 5k trail from the Matthaehi Campus Gardens to near Geddes. Every Mass was represented, English and Spanish speakers, student- and resident-parishioners, a priest, and at least one member of our youth Confirmation class! The walkers came back just as the first of the runners was returning, and we cheered each other on and in. Thank you to the many who helped make the morning. The other winner of the day was the maple-iced Washtenaw Dairy donuts -- a runaway favorite!

St Mary collected a total of **\$13,500** to date: \$7475 via the "St Mary Student Parish" team on the IntSam website, about \$1400 via the St Mary's website to date, and resident-parishioner and IntSam program manager Andrew Pawuk's team's \$4,485. This means we are now helping roughly 11 families eat for one year through International Samaritan's efforts and staff. Thank you! Rainey Lamey and Leo Brito



IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

Holy Men and Women to Admire

As we near the end of the liturgical year we remember those who have gone before us and remain connected to us through the Communion of Saints. We also honor the “official” saints, those holy people we can admire and strive to emulate.

St. Ignatius was influenced and shaped by the lives of earlier saints, including St. Francis of Assisi. In fact, reading about the lives of the saints helped to turn his heart toward God as he recovered from a severe battle injury.

In the years that followed, he created his *Spiritual Exercises*. This includes a key meditation called “The Meditation on Two Standards.” It helps us to think about the qualities that make us holy, and to especially contemplate the qualities of Jesus, so we can follow his “standard,” or flag.

In this meditation, Ignatius asks us to compare the characteristics of a holy and good leader – someone we would admire and follow willingly – with the qualities to those of a bad (or worldly) leader. The exercise brings to mind a couple of questions for us.

Who do we get behind and revere in today’s world (celebrities, politicians)?

What are the leadership qualities of Jesus? How do they compare with the standards the world has set up for us? And finally, which do I choose?

“All disciples have to choose where we are going to stand—with Jesus or with the world. No matter what life the Spirit has drawn us to, once we are baptized and confirmed we are called to stand in Jesus’ company under his flag.

We begin to move under Jesus’ standard when we join him in the living conviction that everything we have and are is God’s gift. However much or little we

have, we say gratefully, “Look at all God has given me.” Then the way opens through the smoke of self-satisfaction and approval of others. “How can I help?” becomes a daily preoccupation. And through a life of love and service, the Spirit leads us to live as meekly and humbly as the Lord lived—whether we are a famous ballerina or an anonymous computer programmer.”

When we contemplate God’s holiest people, the saints, we discover they have a lot in common: humility, selfless love and a desire to follow and live like Jesus. We can follow those “standards” too.

***Strengthen me daily with Your love, and guide me
along life's paths. AMEN.***

Note: As a Jesuit parish, we are joining with Jesuits around the world to celebrate a special “Ignatian Year.” Through July 2022, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after his legs were shattered by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the “shattering” changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?

INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

Baptism preparation class is required to be taken for your first child. If you've taken the class elsewhere, proof of that will be necessary to schedule a baptism.

Classes are on Monday 6:30-7:30 PM on the following dates. **11/1 and 12/6**. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

Whether you are an English-learner or want to help someone improve their language skills, we welcome you. Tutors and learners meet individually or in small groups each week for 45-60 minutes over zoom. Meetings can be at a time that is convenient for you.




