BUILDING CONNECTIONS WITH THE MARGINALIZED

BY RUBY PEREZ, FAITH DOING JUSTICE INTERN



Hello, SMSP! My name is Ruby Pérez, I'm a senior majoring in Acting, and I'm this year's Faith Doing Justice Intern. Growing up in Oakland, California— a city that is home to more than 4,000 unhoused people—

I often felt helpless. There are more empty houses than people without homes in Oakland. I've always looked to Christ for solutions to economic and social inequities. How can my drop in the bucket, in an increasingly unjust world, make a lasting impact? On my faith journey, growth has looked like embracing my call, as a Catholic, to action toward social justice.

Embracing that call through this internship has been transformative. At Alpha House, during our first parish-wide opportunity to volunteer, I spent time with the children currently being housed there—drawing Halloween pictures, doing math homework, and riding bikes. It was a small drop in the bucket that brought joy to both families residing at Alpha House and volunteers from our parish. I want to extend gratitude to all who generously donated their time and resources.

I am thrilled to share with you that two opportunities are ahead of us to serve the marginalized in our community. To leave drops in the bucket that do, in fact, have a lasting impact on our community.

Monday, November 29th through Monday, December 5th, we will be hosting an overnight shelter in Newman Hall for men experiencing

homelessness. There are three ways to get involved. Volunteers may sign up to provide snacks for our guests, to serve as welcome hosts (helping set up and welcome guests as they arrive), or to serve as overnight hosts (staying awake with another volunteer for one night shift and rotating with another pair of volunteers to rest for the next shift). We invite you—parishioners and students, to help us create a warm and welcoming place for members of our community to rest.

Saturday, December 4th from 10am-4pm, we will celebrate our parish feast day and honor our patron Mary by saying yes to God's call for action towards social justice. We will gather for prayer and service with local nonprofits and social service organizations. We invite you to join us in donating time to these organizations and the communities they serve. The deadline to sign up is November 24th.

I am looking forward to connecting with you all through these opportunities, to building connections with the marginalized in our community, and to engaging with meaningful action towards social justice. Have a blessed November.

NOVEMBER IS BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH

On July 24, 1990 the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to celebrate the long history and proud heritage of Black Catholics. November marks a time when the Church prays for all saints and souls in loving remembrance. It's also a good time to recall the saints and souls of Africa and the African Diaspora.

Black Catholics trace their faith history back to Christian antiquity long before other nations heard the "Good News." Christian Africa was a "leading light" in early Christendom. Black Catholics point to three popes who were born in Africa: Saints Victor I, Melchisedech, and Gelasius I.

In observance of National Black Catholic History Month, Catholic leaders have published a number of articles about important black leaders in the American Catholic Church. Among these are Sister Thea Bowman, and Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton, born to slaves in 1854.

INFANT BAPTISM AT SMSP

St. Mary Student Parish is grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. Those wishing to have their children baptized at St. Mary Student Parish should be registered members here for at least three months and active, contributing members of the parish.

Baptism preparation class is required to be taken for your first child. If you've taken the class elsewhere, proof of that will be necessary to schedule a baptism.

Classes are on Monday 6:30-7:30 PM on the following date: **12/6, 1/10, 2/7, 3/7, 4/4 & 5/2**. During the class there is an opportunity to ask questions and schedule the baptism date. The class is required to be taken only once. It does not need to be repeated for additional children.

If you are able, we ask that you pick up a baptism preparation packet from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the class. The packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents.



IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

Friends of the Poor

In 2019, the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) adopted a set of four “Apostolic Preferences” to help guide their work and unite them in their mission over the next 10 years. It’s a mission aimed at making a “Gospel difference,” in the world, and includes all of us who work with them to achieve these goals.

The Preferences include: Showing the Way to God (through the Spiritual Exercises and Discernment), Walking with the Excluded, Journeying with Youth (to create a hope-filled future), and Caring for our Common Home.

Walking with the Excluded encourages many ways to walk with the poor, the outcasts of the world and those whose dignity has been violated. It is a mission of reconciliation and justice.

Here at St. Mary Student Parish, we remain committed to the idea of solidarity with the poor. Our bulletin each week lists opportunities to help feed people at Mercy House, as well as helping out at upcoming events, such as the Feast Day of Service, and the Daytime Warming Shelter which will be hosted here throughout the month of January.

Jesuit priest Roberto Jaramillo, S.J. summed up this Preference in a homily he gave in 2019 to a Jesuit Congress in Rome. He spoke of the Jesuits that were being honored at the Congress as “collaborators in the mission of Christ.” What they all have in common, he said, is that they worked toward “friendship with the poor,” just as Jesus did.

“Friends of the poor we must be if we want to be the ferment of a new world, of a crazy – truly divine love; friends of the poor we must be, first and foremost, because – in a world structured in injustice and

oppression – that is the only way of salvation, of liberation, of true and definitive happiness. Saint Ignatius already said it in 1547, in his letter to the Jesuits of the Padua school: “friendship with the poor makes us friends of the eternal King”; and that people (and institutions) who feel safe because of the economic resources they have are not assured of continuous joy, rather than: “the rich are full of storms” and do not live happily and satisfied “the great merchants, magistrates, princes and other great characters.”

Ignatius taught us that daily prayer unites us with Jesus, but our response to God’s great love is that we then move forward in concrete action (being contemplatives in action). Jesus modeled this love for us, Fr. Jaramillo says. Jesus fed the multitudes, washed the feet of his disciples and showed us a King whose power comes only from “loving without conditions.”

Note: *As a parish administered by Jesuit priests, we are joining the world-wide celebration of a special “Ignatian Year.” Through July 2022, we will reflect on the conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, who turned his life toward God after his legs were shattered by a cannonball in battle 500 years ago. We pray that this Jubilee will be a time to reflect on our own moments of conversion. What are the “shattering” changes we experience that can open our hearts to God?*



ONLINE GIVING NEWS

In April 2020, we added a new online giving platform – “Parishsoft Online Giving”. We are grateful for all who are currently using the system and have received positive feedback on how user friendly it is. We would like to move all online giving over to this platform and discontinue using the legacy system by December 31, 2021. This will reduce the cost of maintaining two systems.

Parishsoft is offering a Donor Match Program for all givers who add new recurring donations from November 1 through December 31. For every new recurring donation that is added in that time period, Parishsoft will match the donation, up to \$50, with a maximum match of \$1,000 per organization.


