#### JANUARY DAYTIME WARMING CENTER REFLECTION

In January of 2014, Michigan was in the middle of a polar vortex, for weeks on end temperatures were rarely above zero when you factored in the wind-chill. That same year, due to budget cuts, the Delonis Shelter cut weather amnesty (the temperature at which folks can stay in the shelter during the day) to 10 degrees Fahrenheit. You read that right—10 degrees. We know frost bite and hypothermia can set in at much higher temperatures than that. Concerned about our friends, MISSION board members Peggy Lynch and Sheri Wander approached Father Dan Reim about using the basement of St. Mary's "for a week or so" until the arctic blast was over. He said yes, "a week or so" ended up being closer to 6 weeks - and the daytime warming center was born.

Eight years later and St. Mary's continues to be a host and strong supporter of this unique program whose mission remains the same. The Washtenaw County Day Warming Center is a democratically self-governed space created and run by those experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity. In partnership with local faith communities, community groups, and the Shelter Association of Washtenaw County, we are a warm and welcoming space where people can gather to share their experiences, their stories, their skills, resources and friendship. In doing so we keep one another safer and break down the barriers between "homeless" and "homeful" people in our communities.

The 2021-2022 season is staffed by Ben, Peatmoss and myself, as well as over 90 volunteers who bring food, play chess, talk with guests, drop off donations, make coffee, bring coffee, wash blankets, help with clean-up, organize donations, listen, share stories, and build community. While, due to concerns around Covid, we have not been able to have as many activities as possible, we are looking forward to hair cuts, and movie days.



We were able to host a Vaccine Clinic (Covid vaccines and boosters as well as flu vaccines ) in partnership with Packard Health and the Washtenaw County Health Department.

## MEALS FOR THE HOME-LESS AT MERCY HOUSE

Mercy House, located at 805 W. Huron Street in Ann Arbor, is an oasis of hope for people experiencing homelessness, providing meals, showers, clothing and personal care items. We are looking for individuals who could prepare and drop off a meal for 25-30 people on Mondays or Wednesdays, with a 5:45pm drop-off at the house. Typically, one person provides the main dish, and another provides sides and dessert, but some do both. 13 x 9 aluminum pans work best, as they do not need to be returned and will be reused by the community. (Also accepted are grocery gift cards, in any amount, to buy the ingredients to prepare a meal.)





## JUSTFAITH FAITH & RACIAL EQUITY SMALL GROUP INTEREST SURVEY



Please join us this Lent as we participate in the JustFaith Faith & Racial Equity: Exploring Power & Privilege program. This nine session program awakens individuals and groups to the economic systems, public policies, cultural norms, and hidden biases that empower some and oppress others. This material is rooted in scripture and prayer and invites participants to explore how their faith informs their response to their learning. Additionally participants are invited to discern action steps for

working toward racial equity in their own communities.

Each session lasts approximately 1 ½ hours and participants commit to 1-2 hours of reading, watching videos, and reflecting between sessions. Depending on facilitator and participant preferences these sessions will meet on Zoom or in person.

This past Fall a group of SMSP and St. Francis parishioners explored this material together. Here are two reflections from program participants:

"The JustFaith program did a fantastic job at showing me where I could grow in my desire to be anti-racist. In this spiritually based program, I learned that although I feel like someone with progressive views, I still benefit from systemic racism and need to take action in sometimes uncomfortable spaces to truly bring about change. Being in a small group of thoughtful and loving human beings helped me feel supported as I sorted this out. I am committed to furthering the cause of justice in our world." -Angie

"I knew I wanted to have Christ begin unwrapping the layers and layers of white privilege in me that limit me helping Him make real God's Love, Joy, and Peace in everyday life. I can't let the events of the last year in this country fade away in public or in me. The JustFaith Ministry SCC took me to a place of dis-ease with myself, with my perspectives, with my social narratives, but our group kept that space one of God's Love, the only way a fertile seed for something new from Christ can grow. I'm grateful for our facilitator and my faith sharing group and the programming the JustFaith ministry provides -- provocative and healing, grounded in reality and hopeful." -Rainey

## IN THE SPIRIT OF IGNATIUS

#### TOUCHING OUR INNER CORE

Karl A. Meninger, M.D., in an article on intimacy, talks about intimacy being a quality of a person, not a relationship. He says "in so far as I can be close to myself, I can be close to others; in so far as I can be intimate to myself, I can be intimate with others." The deepest part of each one of us is within us, we are touching the God within.

God speaks to us in our deepest human experiences, feelings, desires, thoughts, or ideas. So to be aware of these experiences is to become aware of God's work in them and then to offer ourselves through them to God. We focus on our own experience to hear God's word in them and then are called to respond. What is God saying to us through this?

We don't need to solve problems, worry, plan, or control. In other words, we recognize the God within and then listen reverently to the many ways God speaks to us through our thoughts, our feelings, our children, our students, our fellow workers.

Intimacy then is not primarily a sharing with another. Intimacy starts with being intimate with myself. Intimacy is knowing the core of things myself. Then what I do flows from where I've been. But intimacy begins with getting in contact with myself. I have to be in contact with myself before I can donate, give myself or share. It is important to get in touch with our deepest human experiences because that is where God is present to us. Where we are most present, God is most present.

I need nothing but your prayer. We'll be back dancing in a month. Be assured of my prayers and love for all of you.
