#### OUR SACRAMENTAL POLICY

Six month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptism: Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requests that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic, and the Godparents must be practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If there are two godparents, one must be male, one must be female. If there is one godparent, they may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Call the Rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be the Parish Pastor, Deacon, or a family member.

*Funerals*: Officiate must be the Parish Pastor of Immaculate Conception, or a family member

Please note: the services of the Parish Organists are used for all Weddings and Funerals.



#### ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON - JANUARY 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."

# Immaculate Conception Catholic Church Parish Finance Council Meeting Minutes for November 23rd, 2021

Present: Fr. Brian Hurley, Al Landosky (Chair), Janet Engelman (Co-Chair), Jim Hogan, Pat Gleason, Daniel Dudzinski (Bookkeeper) available as resource, Bill Ruhlman from MBA Real Estate. Absent: Kevin Polega, Leonard Gayeski, and Fred Green.

The meeting began at 7:30pm.

- 1.) Father opened the meeting with a prayer.
- Minutes from the September 28<sup>th</sup> meeting had been reviewed and approved via email on October 15th.
- 3.) Bill Ruhlman, our real estate agent for the St. Louise property, opened the meeting with a discussion regarding the sale of the property. There has been an offer made on the property by the neighbor who borders the North side of the property. The parish is now waiting on the Archdiocese to give final approval for the sale. We should have an answer by the end of November. Part of the discussion also revolved around the property inside the buildings and a timeline for clearing out whatever is not going to the purchaser. Bill estimates we have about sixty days to get any church property out of the buildings once the AOD gives final approval for the sale.
- 4.) Al mentioned that the Knights of Columbus would be happy to assist in the packing and moving process. Fred has already been able to dispose of some items in the buildings. He will continue with this over the next few weeks. Bill mentioned we should have about 60 days after approval is given, to get everything moved out of the buildings.
- 5.) Al and Jim then lead a discussion on the Roof and HVAC planning. Jim has made arrangements with Keith Mackenzie to be here at the parish along with an HVAC engineer to begin developing the plans for the new HVAC system on Wednesday December 1st. Tom Engelman from Kapala Heating and Cooling will also be in attendance at the meeting. More meetings with our general contractor are expected.
- 6.) Family of Parishes was mentioned and a brief discussion ensued. More information to come.
- 7.) All also talked briefly about the incorporation of all the parishes in the Archdiocese which happened this year. The impact on the parish both from a financial standpoint and a management standpoint were discussed. Father will be in touch with the AOD and have more information as it becomes available.

Fr. Hurley closed out the meeting with a prayer.

The meeting adjourned at approx. 9:00pm.
