OUR SACRAMENTAL POLICY

Six month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptism: Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requests that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic, and the Godparents must be practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If there are two godparents, one must be male, one must be female. If there is one godparent, they may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Call the Rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be the Parish Pastor, Deacon, or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be the Parish Pastor of Immaculate Conception, or a family member

Please note: the services of the Parish Organists are used for all Weddings and Funerals.



SUNDAY READINGS


At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language.

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews,


Jesus came and stood in their midst

MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart, because the feast of the Sacred Heart is celebrated each year during this month.

It all started when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received private revelations from Jesus Christ. Jesus spoke to her on June 16, 1675, and asked her specifically to promote a feast that honored his Sacred Heart.

"I ask of you that the Friday after the Octave of Corpus Christi be set apart for a special Feast to honor My Heart, by communicating on that day, and making reparation to It by a solemn act, in order to make amends for the indignities which It has received during the time It has been exposed on the altars. I promise you that My Heart shall expand Itself to shed in abundance the influence of Its Divine Love upon those who shall thus honor It, and cause It to be honored."

The feast of Corpus Christi has been celebrated after Trinity Sunday for many centuries and always falls during the month of June.

The precise date fluctuates each year, as it is determined by the celebration of Easter.

It took until 1856 for the feast of the Sacred Heart to be officially celebrated by the universal Church, and ever since then the month of June has been focused on devotion to the Heart of Jesus and his divine love for humanity. (*Aleteia*, 2021)

ASK DEACON JOE

At Benediction, when the priest or deacon says, "You have given them bread from heaven," what is the proper response? Everyone seems to say something different and it ends up a mumbled mess each Thursday evening. What is the current translation?

I agree that it is very confusing. As a matter of tradition, I have always responded, "Having within it all sweetness." But I tried to check the official Order for the Solemn Exposition of the Holy Eucharist to see what is says. And I was surprised to find that the exchange between the minister and the congregation is not even mentioned. Apparently, the exchange is actually an addition to the Tantum Ergo hymn which is sung to initiate the Benediction rite. And the response in the original Latin is, "Omne delectamentum in se habentem." So, how should this be translated? I went to a couple of online translators and I found, "Everything delicious in one bowl," and "Having in it every delicious thing," and also "Every dish is delicious." None of these seems very appropriate, so I checked the U.S. Bishops' website and found, "Having all delight within it," which is much more similar to the traditional response. It is also similar to, but still

different from, the text in our missalettes that many use as an accompaniment during Benediction. It reads, "Containing in itself all delight." An 1857 collection of prayers gives us, "And therein was sweetness of every kind." Wikipedia claims that the literal translation is, "Having in itself all delight." But they go on to say that, "Having within it all sweetness" fits better when the response is sung along with Tantum Ergo.

No wonder the response on Thursday evening is so muddled. I have talked with Fr. Hurley and Deacon Butler and we are in agreement that we should use the traditional response, "Having within it all sweetness," since we typically sing the Tantum Ergo and chant the exchange. Let us respond clearly and confidently lifting one voice in praise to the Lord. Deacon Joe


