### OUR SACRAMENTAL POLICY

Six month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage. *Baptism*: Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requests that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic, and the Godparents must be practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If there are two godparents, one must be male, one must be female. If there is one

godparent, they may be male or female.

*Marriage*: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Call the Rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be the Parish Pastor, Deacon, or a family member.

*Funerals*: Officiate must be the Parish Pastor of Immaculate Conception, or a family member

Please note: the services of the Parish Organists are used for all Weddings and Funerals.



he blessed Abram with these words:


"Blessed be Abram by God Most High, the creator of heaven and earth;

# ST. THOMAS MORE - JUNE 22

Sir Thomas More was a humanist and statesman in Tudor England. More was a prolific writer and theologian. He was beatified by Pope Leo XIII in 1886, and canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 19, 1935. More was born in London in 1478, the son of Sir John More, a lawyer and judge. He attended Oxford where he studied Latin and Greek, as well as formal logic. He left Oxford in 1494 to train as a lawyer in London. After attaining the Bar, he spent time discerning a call to the priesthood. Though attracted to the Franciscan order More remained a lay Christian, continuing to fast, pray, and wear a hair shirt. He was married twice, the loving father of three daughters, a stepdaughter by his second marriage, and one son. More wrote many letters to his children when he was away on business and his daughters were known for their academic abilities, as they received the same education as his son, an anomaly at the time. He became the good friend and advisor to Henry VIII, and in 1521 he was knighted. In 1529 he was made Lord Chancellor of England. However, this appointment was the beginning of the end for the saint. He could not support the break with the Church in Rome when Henry failed to receive from the Pope the annulment of his first marriage to Katherine of Aragon to wed Anne Boleyn. More resigned as Lord Chancellor and continued to refuse to accept Henry as the head of the Church in England. Eventually he was imprisoned, tried, and sentenced to a traitor's death, to be hanged, drawn, and quartered. Henry commuted the sentence of his former friend to the more humane beheading. More was executed at Tower Hill, on July 6, 1535, before his death he famously proclaimed that he was "the king's good servant, but God's first."


### FAMILY OF PARISHES

### **ASK DEACON JOE**

#### A question on genuflecting came up in our catechism class. Can you explain genuflecting; when and on how many knees?

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) states: "A genuflection, made by bending the right knee to the ground, signifies adoration, and therefore it is reserved for the Most Blessed Sacrament, as well as for the Holy Cross from the solemn adoration during the liturgical celebration on Good Friday until the beginning of the Easter Vigil." (#274) We genuflect before the Blessed Sacrament, not before the Crucifix except on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, and not before the altar. At Immaculate Conception the tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament is behind the altar and below the crucifix. When we genuflect facing the front of the church, it is good to remember that we are doing so out of adoration for the Blessed Sacrament. If we go to another church, we should always look for the location of the tabernacle so that we can face in that direction as we genuflect before entering our pew. We genuflect whenever we pass in front of the tabernacle, unless we are in a procession. Coming up for communion is considered a form of procession and we do not need to



#### genuflect.

It has been tradition to genuflect on both knees when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the monstrance during Holy Hours. However, the document Eucharistiae Sacramentum, from the 2nd Vatican Council, states: "Genuflection on one knee is prescribed before the Blessed Sacrament whether it be reserved in the tabernacle or exposed for public adoration." (#84) Either way is acceptable. If you prefer genuflecting on both knees before the exposed Blessed Sacrament, that is fine. But don't judge those that choose to genuflect on one knee. Deacon Joe
