Six month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage. Baptism: Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requests that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic, and the Godparents must be practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If there are two godparents, one

must be male, one must be female. If there is one godparent, they may be male or female.

*Marriage*: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Call the Rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be the Parish Pastor, Deacon, or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be the Parish Pastor of Immaculate Conception, or a family member

Please note: the services of the Parish Organists are used for all Weddings and Funerals.



# ASK DEACON JOE What is the Church's teaching on the blessing of rosaries and other religious articles?

When items, such as rosaries, are blessed, they become Sacramentals. Sacramentals can indirectly lead us on a path to obtain actual graces, unlike the Sacraments that effectively confer sanctifying graces upon us. The Baltimore Catechism states: "A sacramental is anything set apart or blessed by the Church to excite good thoughts and to increase devotion" (Question 1052). It also states: "The Sacramentals ... move us to truer devotion, to greater love for God and greater sorrow for our sins" (Question 1054).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Among Sacramentals, blessings (of persons, meals, objects, and places) come first. Every blessing praises God and prays for his gifts. In Christ, Christians are blessed by God the Father 'with every spiritual blessing.' This is why the Church imparts blessings by invoking the name of Jesus, usually while making the holy sign of the cross of Christ" (CCC#1671). Article 61 of the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, from the 2nd Vatican Council, points out the value of sacramentals for the people saying that they sanctify "almost every event in their lives" and they give "access to the stream of divine grace which flows from the paschal mystery of the passion, death, the resurrection of Christ, the font from which all sacraments and sacramentals draw their power." The Constitution also addressed the issue of blessing and Sacramentals and directed that they now be allowed in the vernacular, the people's native tongue, because it was thought that it would be of considerable help to the people. (Unfortunately, when some of the prayers of blessing were rewritten into the vernacular they were watered down a bit—some claim to make them more ecumenical. For example, some exorcism prayers were removed. The original blessings can still be used, but only

can be said in Latin, and not translated into the vernacular.)

The Holy See now publishes an official Book of Blessings which is translated into the languages of the world. It lays out the rubrics and prayers for a wide variety of blessings including boats, flocks, engaged couples, and Christmas trees. It is broken into six parts: Blessings directly related to persons, Blessings related to buildings and to various forms of human activity, Blessings of objects that are designed or erected for use in churches, Blessings of articles meant to foster the devotion of the Christian people, Blessings related to feast and seasons, and Blessings for various needs and occasions.

With regard to rosaries, my copy of the Book of Blessings devotes ten pages with different options for priests and deacons to use for their blessing. The simplest formulary, which can be used in special circumstances, calls for the minister to offer this simple prayer while making the sign of the cross: "May this rosary and the one who uses it be blessed, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." - Deacon Joe


#### **Volunteers Needed**

# ST. MAXIMILLIAN KOLBE- AUGUST 14

Courage and sacrificial love mark the life of St. Maximilian Kolbe. He became a priest of the Franciscan order. Dedicated with evangelization, he published a magazine to teach the Catholic faith and encourage devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. During the Nazi occupation of Poland, Fr. Kolbe was arrested and sent to Auschwitz. One day a prisoner escaped from the camp. The Nazi punishment was harsh. For one escapee, 10 must die in his place. The guards picked 10 men at random. One began to beg for his life on behalf of his family, and another man stepped forward and offered to take his place. Fr. Kolbe was sentenced, along with the other nine men, to death by starvation. For this "martyr of Auschwitz," a life of devotion culminated in one heroic, Christlike act.

# **PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN**


