

Dear Parish Family,

I am writing to ask your support for the 2021 Catholic Service Appeal. The CSA is one of the main ways we fund the important works of the Archdiocese of Detroit. WHY DO WE DO THAT? -CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: Why are some saints honored as “patron saints”?

Answer:

Each person is unique and each of us has different gifts, interests, talents, and, yes, even struggles and areas where we need to grow. This is no less true of those holy women, men, and children who have been canonized or beatified.

Because we believe that the saints and *blesseds* are both models of faith and intercessors, Christians have looked to certain holy people as role models and heavenly protectors for occupations, spiritual charisms, and even places. Although the Church sometimes names a person as a patron saint (e.g. Saint Philip Neri as the patron of Rome, Saint Clare of Assisi as the patroness of television, or Saint Aloysius Gonzaga as the patron of youth and young adults), more often it is popular devotion that inspires lay Christians to turn to a particular saint or blessed for heavenly help and support. This is how, for example, Saint Cecilia came to be honored as the patroness of musicians, Saint Toribio Romo as patron of migrants coming into the United States, and Saint Gertrude of Nivelles as patroness of cat lovers. Although there are official and unofficial lists of patron saints, we should always feel free to ask any and all the saints to give us their patronage and protection in whatever it is that we need.

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Del Papa-Grimaldi-Gabriele and Lilo Wendell Scholarships funded through the Archdiocese of Detroit Endowment Foundation each provide one or more college scholarships for the 2021-2022 academic year. Application forms are available in the parish office and at <https://www.detroitcatholicschools.org/tuition-assistance-scholarships>. High school seniors and first-year college students are eligible for the Del Papa-Grimaldi-Gabriele Scholarship. High school seniors and first-year college students who are Catholic daughters of single mothers and members of a parish in the Archdiocese are eligible for the Lilo Wendell Scholarship. Other eligibility details are included in the application forms. Completed application forms must be sent to the Archdiocese of Detroit no later than June 25, 2021.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When we took up the work of embracing the call of the new evangelization to become a missionary archdiocese, we looked at some key good habits which would be essential to the success of our work. Among those good habits highlighted in Unleash the Gospel were “a spirit of cooperation” and “a spirit of innovation.” While it was not in my mind at that time how these virtues would need to be lived out during a pandemic, I am exceedingly proud of the way our priests, parish staffs, and parishioners have exhibited and exemplified these good habits over the past 14 challenging months.

As we transition away from a heightened state of emergency around the COVID-19 pandemic and take steps toward normality, I ask you to remember these good habits and for each of us to renew our commitment to living them out together. As we have done throughout the pandemic, we must continue to live with a “spirit of cooperation” to adapt to the circumstances we face and, importantly, to care for and protect those who are most vulnerable. We will need a “spirit of innovation” to aid us in determining which changes to keep in place and which ones can and should be relaxed.

While Archdiocesan-wide COVID liturgical protocols are relaxed – in alignment with guidance from national and state public health officials – we realize there are diverse situations and a variety of needs across the six counties of southeast Michigan. Therefore, I have asked pastors to determine how best to adjust parish protocols for the particular needs of their parishes. Each of us is called to keep in mind our need to care for the common good – including a deliberate consideration to receive the COVID vaccine for the good of oneself and one’s neighbor. This care for the common good entails a particular care and love for those who are most vulnerable among us, in this situation the elderly and the immunocompromised. Additionally, these considerations are meant to permit and encourage the reverent offering of and active participation in the Sacred Liturgy. The updated COVID liturgical protocols are as follows:

New COVID Liturgical Protocols

1. Those who are fully vaccinated may wear a face-covering and social distance but are no longer required to do so in churches.
2. Those who have **not been fully vaccinated are to continue wearing face-coverings and to practice social distancing to protect themselves and others in churches.** Because a parish community – and our society – requires mutual trust and a commitment to the common good, each individual is asked to make the best decisions for himself as well as for others. Parishes do not have the responsibility to verify who is and who is not vaccinated.
3. Each parish is to provide a portion of the church – with a size to be determined by the pastor – where social distancing and face-coverings are consistently maintained.
4. All unvaccinated Catholics are encouraged to consult with their doctor about the vaccines. Resources to assist Catholics in understanding the moral use of COVID vaccines can be found at www.aod.org/vaccines.
5. The Sign of Peace may resume with the normal wording, “Offerte vobis pacem / Let us offer each other the sign of peace,” allowing parishioners and families to make their own determinations about how widely to share some sign of peace.


COVID GUIDELINES

COVID Liturgical Protocols which remain in place

1. Parishes should continue to provide signage about current COVID protocols.
2. Parishes should keep doors open to ventilate churches as they are able.
3. Parishes are encouraged to continue the COVID arrangement of vessels for bread/wine on the altar.
4. Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should continue to wear masks while distributing Holy Communion.
5. Parishes are encouraged to maintain sanitization stations at the locations of the distribution of Holy Communion.
6. Parishes are to continue to refrain from the distribution of the Chalice to the faithful (except for a Bride and Groom on their wedding day).

These revised liturgical protocols should be a sign that we have made great progress from March 2020. But we still need to be vigilant in the weeks and months ahead. As we continue to adapt to a new reality, it will be crucial that each of us exercises heroic patience with one another. For some these changes are a welcome adjustment. For others, it will take more time to feel comfortable with the adjustments. For all, this is an opportunity for Christian charity and a renewed commitment to exercise another Unleash the Gospel virtue: unusually gracious hospitality.

Be Healthy: Public places on parish campuses are frequently cleaned and sanitized. These are precautionary measures, but the risk of coming into contact with the virus remains. It is important for individuals and families to take personal responsibility to protect themselves.


Be Smart: Social distancing and spacing must be practiced by all individuals on parish properties. All are encouraged to follow CDC guidelines for handwashing and hand sanitizer use. Bring your own hand sanitizer to use before receiving Holy Communion. All attendees ages 2 and up must wear a face covering on campus and during Mass.

Be Holy: Remember to be patient and kind. Pastors and parishes will do their best to offer Holy Mass, Holy Communion, and Confession, but may face challenges because of the health and/or age of priests, staff and volunteers. This means every parish may do things a little differently.

WHAT IS SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion, which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshiping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. We ask Jesus to unite Himself with us. The basic elements of An Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith, an Act of Love, and a desire to receive Christ, and invitation for him to come into our heart.

SACRAMENTS

Please note . These guidelines apply under normal conditions policy and procedures may change , as needed, in response to the COVID 19 pandemic. Please call the parish family office for more details.

INFANT BAPTISM

Baptisms can be scheduled for the First Sunday of each month at St. Cornelius, the Second Sunday at St. John the Evangelist, with the exception of Lent. Parents must be registered and active members of the clustered parishes for a minimum of three months prior to the arrangement of their child's baptism.

Parents expecting a child are encouraged to contact the parish office prior to the birth of their baby. Both parents and godparents are required to attend the preparation class prior to the baptism. Please contact the office for class times and locations.

MARRIAGE

At least one member of the couple requesting marriage must be registered and active member of the clustered parishes for a minimum of three months prior to filling out the wedding application. (Engaged couples should not be registered under his/her parents.) Applications must be completed a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date to ensure adequate marriage preparation.

PARTH MEMBERSHIP

The Sacrament of Baptism makes us members of Christ's Body: The Church. As disciples of the Lord we at the parish family of St. Cornelius, St. John the Evangelist live out our Christian faith through the Roman Catholic Tradition. The rights and expectations of the members of the community include: the sacraments, one's spiritual, educational, and social formation, as well as a Christian burial. The community for its part expects that those choosing to be members will keep holy the Sabbath Day, as well as other days of Obligation. Members are encouraged and expected to contribute their time, talent, and financial resources according to their ability in order to maintain, up-build and strengthen the community of faith to which they belong.




