From Archbishop Vigneron and The Department of

Communications shares the following reminders for COVID-19. With the recent increase in COVID-19 cases in Michigan, and the approaching winter season, we wish remind clergy and parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit's current guidelines for liturgies:

- *The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages Mass-goers, regardless of vaccination status, to wear face-coverings and to practice social distancing to reduce exposure to COVID-19
- *The Archdiocese of Detroit strongly recommends that each pastor/In Solidum team should evaluate their location in the Archdiocese and implement the following protocols:
- * Ensure that hand sanitizer is readily available at church entrances and near the sanctuary Evaluate space for the choir, and strongly recommend that those who are unvaccinated do not participate in the choir at this time
- * The faithful are reminded that particular dispensations from the obligation to participate in Holy Mass remain in effect for people who are ill or who find themselves in other specific circumstances. More information is available at aod.org/emergencyresponse

COVID Liturgical Protocols which remain in place

- 1. Parishes should continue to provide signage about current COVID protocols.
- 2. Parishes should keep doors open to ventilate churches as they are able.
- 3. Parishes are encouraged to continue the COVID arrangement of vessels for bread/wine on the altar.
- 4. Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may continue to wear masks while distributing Holy Communion. (Optional)
- 5. Parishes are encouraged to maintain sanitization stations at the locations of the distribution of Holy Communion. These revised liturgical protocols should be a sign that we have made great progress from March 2020. But we still need to be vigilant in the weeks and months ahead. As we continue to adapt to a new reality, it will be crucial that each of us exercises heroic patience with one another. For some these changes are a welcome adjustment. For others, it will take more time to feel comfortable with the adjustments. For all, this is an opportunity for Christian charity and a renewed commitment to exercise another Unleash the Gospel virtue: unusually gracious hospitality.

WELCOME ARCHBISHOP RUSSELL

Pope appoints Vatican diplomat Archbishop Russell as Detroit Auxiliary bishop

Having served the Church all over the world, Archbishop Russell brings to the Archdiocese of Detroit a valuable perspective of the universal Church and our mission to make joyful missionary disciples of all nations.

May 23, 2022 — Pope Francis has named Archbishop Paul Fitzpatrick Russell as the 31st auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese of Detroit. He will be welcomed to the Archdiocese of Detroit at a Liturgy of Welcome and Inauguration of Ministry on July 7, 2022 at 2 p.m. at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Detroit.

Having been given the title "Archbishop" ad personam by Pope Francis when he was appointed Apostolic Nuncio to Turkey and Turkmenistan in March 2016, Archbishop Russell will retain this title while serving as an auxiliary bishop in the Archdiocese of Detroit. An auxiliary bishop aids the ordinary (diocesan bishop) in the pastoral care of an archdiocese.

"We are deeply grateful to Pope Francis for appointing Archbishop Russell as auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese of Detroit, and we are similarly grateful to Archbishop Russell for accepting this new ministry," Archbishop Vigneron said. "We are particularly glad to welcome Archbishop Russell home to Michigan, where he grew up and first heard the Lord call him to the priestly vocation. Having



served the Church all over the world, Archbishop Russell brings to the Archdiocese of Detroit a valuable perspective of the universal Church and our mission to make joyful missionary disciples of all nations."

Archbishop Russell was born on May 2, 1959 in Greenfield, Massachusetts, to the late Isabelle Fitzpatrick and Thaddeus Russell. When he was in the third grade, his family moved to his mother's hometown of Alpena, Michigan where Russell attended St. Bernard of Clairvaux elementary school and Alpena High School. He entered St. John's Seminary in Boston, Massachusetts, and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Boston on June 20, 1987. He served in parish ministry for five years and one year as personal secretary to the Cardinal Archbishop. Following further study in Rome at the Pontifical Ecclesiastical Academy and the Pontifical Gregorian University, he entered the diplomatic service of the Holy See, serving in the Secretariat of State and the Apostolic Nunciatures (Vatican embassies) in Ethiopia, Zimbabwe, Turkey, Switzerland (where he also served in parish ministry), and Nigeria.

On May 2, 2008, Pope Benedict XVI named him *Chargé d'Affaires* of the Apostolic Nunciature in Taiwan.

On March 19, 2016, Pope Francis appointed Russell as Apostolic Nuncio to Turkey and Turkmenistan. He was consecrated Titular Archbishop of Novi in Dalmatia on June 3, 2016 in the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston by Cardinal Seán O'Malley. Archbishop Allen Vigneron of Detroit and Archbishop Leo Cushley of St. Andrews and Edinburgh (Scotland) served as co-consecrators. Pope Francis appointed Archbishop Russell as Apostolic Nuncio to Azerbaijan, in addition to his service in Turkey and Turkmenistan, on April 7, 2018.

"I am so happy with Pope Francis' decision to send me home and look forward to serving as an auxiliary bishop in the Archdiocese of Detroit and immersing myself in the mission and ministry of the local Church in southeast Michigan," Archbishop Russell said. "Since we first met in Boston 30 years ago, Archbishop Vigneron has shown me fraternal support on various occasions, and now his warm welcome to the Archdiocese is a source of special gratitude."

WHAT IS SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion, which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshiping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. We ask Jesus to unite Himself with us. The basic elements of An Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith, an Act of Love, and a desire to receive Christ, and invitation for him to come into our heart.

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament, I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul,

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart,

I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.

Never permit me to be separated from You.

Amen.

SACRAMENTS

Please note . These guidelines apply under normal conditions policy and procedures may change, as needed, in response to the COVID 19 pandemic. Please call the parish family office for more details.

INFANT BAPTISM

Baptisms can be scheduled for the First Sunday of each month at St. Cornelius, the Second Sunday at St. John the Evangelist, with the exception of Lent. Parents must be registered and active members of the clustered parishes for a minimum of three months prior to the arrangement of their child's baptism.

Parents expecting a child are encouraged to contact the parish office prior to the birth of their baby. Both parents and godparents are required to attend the preparation class prior to the baptism. Please contact the office for class times and locations.

MARRIAGE

At least one member of the couple requesting marriage must be registered and active member of the clustered parishes for a minimum of three months prior to filling out the wedding application. (Engaged couples should not be registered under his/her parents.) Applications must be completed a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date to ensure adequate marriage preparation.

PARISH MEMBERSHIP

The Sacrament of Baptism makes us members of Christ's Body: The Church. As disciples of the Lord we at the parish family of St. Cornelius, St. John the Evangelist live out our Christian faith through the Roman Catholic Tradition. The rights and expectations of the members of the community include: the sacraments, one's spiritual, educational, and social formation, as well as a Christian burial. The community for its part expects that those choosing to be members will keep holy the Sabbath Day, as well as other days of Obligation. Members are encouraged and expected to contribute their time, talent, and financial resources according to their ability in order to maintain, up-build and strengthen the community of faith to which they belong.
