





GOSPEL MEDITATION

We can learn a great deal from Mister Rogers. Remember him? He was the gentle soul who found his way into living rooms worldwide starting as far back as 1968. Mister Rogers' Neighborhood was a beloved program that celebrated and exalted people, especially children. He taught us that we are neighbors and that everyone has a place. Everyone matters. He had a vision, born of his relationship with God that highlighted every human life's innocence, beauty, and uniqueness. To that end, he called us to be responsible for each other, saying nothing different than what Jesus said. Viewers quickly learned that life is not just about me.

"We live in a world in which we need to share responsibility. It's easy to say, 'It's not my child, not



my community, not my world, not my problem.' Then there are those who see the need and respond. I consider those people my heroes (Fred Rogers)." It is so easy to look the other way. After all, I'm not the one who needs to leave home out of fear and try to find somewhere safe. I am not the one who is hungry and without shelter or food. I am not the one who has a child being bullied or ridiculed because of the way they dress or act. I am not the one being threatened with violence or unable to find meaningful work. The distress and agony of our neighbors are our distress and agony. We cannot walk by it with an attitude of indifference, especially if we call ourselves believers. When we no longer care, we have suffocated our souls. This is a great sin.

God's law "is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out." We all have a need for love and acceptance. That's why Mister Rogers' television show was so popular. It spoke to something deeper, something sacred about humanity. God didn't give us his law in a book. He wrote it on our hearts. We know what we need to do. It's a matter of choice. Love is sacred. When we love another human being, especially without regard for ourselves, it is a holy moment. These moments are often missed due to our self-serving agendas and rules. ©LPi



From Archbishop Vigneron and The Department of

Communications shares the following reminders for COVID-19. With the recent increase in COVID-19 cases in Michigan, and the approaching winter season, we wish remind clergy and parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit's current guidelines for liturgies:

- *The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages Mass-goers, regardless of vaccination status, to wear face-coverings and to practice social distancing to reduce exposure to COVID-19
- *The Archdiocese of Detroit strongly recommends that each pastor/In Solidum team should evaluate their location in the Archdiocese and implement the following protocols:
- * Ensure that hand sanitizer is readily available at church entrances and near the sanctuary Evaluate space for the choir, and strongly recommend that those who are unvaccinated do not participate in the choir at this time
- * The faithful are reminded that particular dispensations from the obligation to participate in Holy Mass remain in effect for people who are ill or who find themselves in other specific circumstances. More information is available at aod.org/emergencyresponse

COVID Liturgical Protocols which remain in place

- 1. Parishes should continue to provide signage about current COVID protocols.
- 2. Parishes should keep doors open to ventilate churches as they are able.
- 3. Parishes are encouraged to continue the COVID arrangement of vessels for bread/wine on the altar.
- 4. Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may continue to wear masks while distributing Holy Communion. (Optional)
- 5. Parishes are encouraged to maintain sanitization stations at the locations of the distribution of Holy Communion. These revised liturgical protocols should be a sign that we have made great progress from March 2020. But we still need to be vigilant in the weeks and months ahead. As we continue to adapt to a new reality, it will be crucial that each of us exercises heroic patience with one another. For some these changes are a welcome adjustment. For others, it will take more time to feel comfortable with the adjustments. For all, this is an opportunity for Christian charity and a renewed commitment to exercise another Unleash the Gospel virtue: unusually gracious hospitality.

Let us continue to be cautious and healthy—Use common sense
Follow the CDC guidelines for washing & sanitizing your hands
If you are feeling sick or have a fever—STAY HOME
If you have a sick family member at home, or you have been recently exposedSTAY HOME

WHAT IS SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion, which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshiping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. We ask Jesus to unite Himself with us. The basic elements of An Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith, an Act of Love, and a desire to receive Christ, and invitation for him to come into our heart.

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament, I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul,

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart,

I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.

Never permit me to be separated from You.

SACRAMENTS

Please note . These guidelines apply under normal conditions policy and procedures may change , as needed, in response to the COVID 19 pandemic. Please call the parish family office for more details.

INFANT BAPTISM

Baptisms can be scheduled for the First Sunday of each month at St. Cornelius, the Second Sunday at St. John the Evangelist, with the exception of Lent. Parents must be registered and active members of the clustered parishes for a minimum of three months prior to the arrangement of their child's baptism.

Parents expecting a child are encouraged to contact the parish office prior to the birth of their baby. Both parents and godparents are required to attend the preparation class prior to the baptism. Please contact the office for class times and locations.

MARRIAGE

At least one member of the couple requesting marriage must be registered and active member of the clustered parishes for a minimum of three months prior to filling out the wedding application. (Engaged couples should not be registered under his/her parents.) Applications must be completed a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date to ensure adequate marriage preparation.

PARISH MEMBERSHIP

The Sacrament of Baptism makes us members of Christ's Body: The Church. As disciples of the Lord we at the parish family of St. Cornelius, St. John the Evangelist live out our Christian faith through the Roman Catholic Tradition. The rights and expectations of the members of the community include: the sacraments, one's spiritual, educational, and social formation, as well as a Christian burial. The community for its part expects that those choosing to be members will keep holy the Sabbath Day, as well as other days of Obligation. Members are encouraged and expected to contribute their time, talent, and financial resources according to their ability in order to maintain, up-build and strengthen the community of faith to which they belong.

Saint Henry was born in 972 to Henry, Duke of Bavaria, Germany, and his wife Gisela of Burgundy. Saint Henry's early life was permeated with Christianity, among those who guided his education was Bishop Wolfgang of Ratisbon, who became a saint himself. In 995, Saint Henry succeeded his father as Duke of Bavaria, and in 1002, upon the death of his cousin, Otho III, he was

elected emperor. In 1014, Saint Henry undertook the long journey from

Germany to Rome to be crowned Holy Roman Emperor by Pope Benedict XIII.'

In 1022 Saint Henry assisted Pope Benedict VIII in holding the Council of Pavia, which promoted clerical celibacy and sought to end simony (the buying and selling of ecclesiastical goods and offices). During his reign, Saint Henry used his wealth and position for the Church. He confirmed Benedict's authority over Rome, was a patron of churches and monasteries, supported the Cluniac Reforms, restored episcopal sees, and founded the Diocese of Bamburg where he built a cathedral.

Saint Henry was married to Cunigunde of Luxembourg, to whom he was incredibly devoted. Although disputed by some historians, some stories of the couple's marriage report they took vows of chastity because their union was childless.
