

The Assumption

Question:

What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?

Answer:

Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God's will, living each day with confidence in God's mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus' public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: "For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people."

It is this image of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God's grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches. ©LPi

LIVE THE LITURGY-INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

There is a "great cloud of witnesses" found in the official saints of the church and in ordinary people we meet every day. They are faith-filled inspirations who, by their example, help us to persevere in our faith. Living in a sea of conflict, change, challenge, and confusion, it is easy to grow tired and get weary. With so many things in competition for our attention, it is challenging to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus and the Kingdom of God. We have to keep running the race and continue proclaiming the Good News. This message is not always welcome. It can cause division, challenge accepted mindsets, ruffle peoples' feathers, and cause some folks to become defensive. God's ways are not always our ways. Even though often rejected by the world, the message of God in Jesus Christ must continue to be preached. We can rely on the examples of faith before us and around us and not lose heart. As Jesus endured the voices of opposition, so too can we.

Is a monk a priest or a brother? And what is a friar?

This is a much more involved question than it first appears. In general there are three states of life for members of the Church: clergy, religious, and laity.

The clergy consists of men who have been ordained, i.e. they have received the Sacrament of Holy Orders. These are bishops, priests, and deacons.

Religious are men and women who profess the evangelical counsels (counsels of perfection). They take solemn vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience; or no money, no honey, no say. Women religious are called nuns or sisters. Men religious are called monks or friars depending on their religious order. Monks belong to orders such as the Benedictines, Trappists, and Carthusians and focus more on solitude and contemplation. Friars belong to orders such as the Franciscans, Dominicans, and Carmelites and focus more on preaching and public ministry.

Some monks and friars are also ordained to the priesthood and are addressed as father. They are called "order priests" in contrast to the "diocesan priests" who minister at most of our parishes. Order priests usually serve at retreat centers and monasteries. (Diocesan priests do not take a vow of poverty.) Friars and monks who are not ordained are commonly called brothers; friar comes from the French word frère which means brother. So in answer to the first question, a monk can be either a priest or a brother.


WATCH THE WOMAN

THE BIBLE AND THE VIRGIN MARY: EPISODE 11: THE ASSUMPTION



WHAT IS SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion, which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshiping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. We ask Jesus to unite Himself with us. The basic elements of An Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith, an Act of Love, and a desire to receive Christ, and invitation for him to come into our heart.

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament, I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul,

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart,

I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.

Never permit me to be separated from You.

SACRAMENTS

Please note . These guidelines apply under normal conditions policy and procedures may change , as needed, in response to the COVID 19 pandemic. Please call the parish family office for more details.

INFANT BAPTISM

Baptisms can be scheduled for St. Cornelius, with the exception of Lent. Parents must be registered and active members of the clustered parishes for a minimum of three months prior to the arrangement of their child's baptism.

Parents expecting a child are encouraged to contact the parish office prior to the birth of their baby. Both parents and godparents are required to attend the preparation class prior to the baptism. Please contact the office for class times and locations.

MARRIAGE

At least one member of the couple requesting marriage must be registered and active member of the clustered parishes for a minimum of three months prior to filling out the wedding application. (Engaged couples should not be registered under his/her parents.) Applications must be completed a minimum of six months prior to the proposed wedding date to ensure adequate marriage preparation.

PARISH MEMBERSHIP

The Sacrament of Baptism makes us members of Christ's Body: The Church. As disciples of the Lord we at the parish family of St. Cornelius, live out our Christian faith through the Roman Catholic Tradition. The rights and expectations of the members of the community include: the sacraments, one's spiritual, educational, and social formation, as well as a Christian burial. The community for its part expects that those choosing to be members will keep holy the Sabbath Day, as well as other days of Obligation. Members are encouraged and expected to contribute their time, talent, and financial resources according to their ability in order to maintain, upbuild and strengthen the community of faith to which they belong.
