

HOPE FOR HAINA

The medical personnel for the clinic has undergone some changes in recent years. Dr. Fremio has left for further studies. Dr. Ramona, who has been involved in the clinic for many years, has taken over the everyday management of the clinic. She is a pediatrician and also works in the clinic two days a week to see the children. Dr. Ortiz is now coming in five days a week to treat patients and is also taking over the operation of the ultrasound equipment. Dr. Ascencio has left to be a mother. The nurses and assistants are continuing their service. And of course, Dr. Cruz, the dentist, continues to see patients two half days a week. While there have been changes the clinic is operating smoothly.

One of the services that the clinic provides is help with needed medicines. According to Sister Carol, mothers often do not bring children to the doctor because they know they will not be able to buy the medicine prescribed. And for the chronically ill with conditions such as diabetes or high blood pressure, which generally don't hurt, prescription medicines become a very low priority when funds are tight. Sometimes everyday needs for pain-killers, common antibiotics and medicines for skin diseases can be a burden.

With money that we send to Haina, the clinic is able to buy these needed medicines and keep the clinic stocked. The clinic provides these medicines to those who cannot afford to pay.




