A NOTE FROM FATHER MIKE

One of my homiletic professors in the seminary suggested that doing exit interviews with departing employees is a good business practice – what that employee liked about the parish, the relationships they built with other staff and parishioners; but he asked us to ponder doing an exit interview with some of the parishioners we anoint as they are dying. How did our parish help them make sense out of their life and in trying to live up to the Gospel?

Our readings this weekend is pretty stark with both Moses and Jesus cast in the similar role of helping the disciples broaden their focus to include all of God's creatures, even those who don't worship or think like we do.

The church asks us this weekend to pray for our Migrants and Refugees with the pope's challenge that our world is not about "them" and "those" but only US. In his pastoral letter to us entitled "Fratelli tutti" he offers the theme "Toward an ever wider WE."

Yes! We have exceeded the 2021 CSA goal and are getting closer to reaching the Parish Target of \$120,688 that is the good news here. Now, please take a closer look at the number of pledges listed this year (126!)

MUSIC MINISTRY

Dear Friends,

This is an open-ended invitation to all. First – off, I hope you are well and safe! I wanted to write as we continue to re-institute the music program here at St. Owen. A few weeks ago, many members of the choir came together for a socially distanced rehearsal that was pretty darn effective. By the time you read this we will have begun our season of singing once again and continue working to prepare music for liturgies and concerts here at St. O. The choir sings roughly two liturgies a month, usually a 5 PM mass as well as an 11 AM mass. If you would like to join, there's always plenty of room. If you've not done choral singing before but would like to learn, I promise it's all learn-able and a very good time. We work hard on creating our sound and learning how the singing voice works. In addition, the choir here is comprised of a hearty bunch of folks who are just a plain ol' good time. Folks who work hard but also enjoy each other's company. If you're interested, we would be glad to have you!

In addition, the handbell folks haven't exactly stopped, as we've heard their presence from time to time at liturgies throughout the summer. If you would like to join the ringing team you are also invited. If you are unsure about any of this business but want to see what it's all about, just contact me and let me know and you can come by and see if any of it looks like the right fit for you.

We meet on Wednesdays at various times. Currently the bells begin at 6:30 and the Chorale "choir" at 7:30. In addition there are small ensembles that you hear from time to time who sing and play and create other sorts of music with the congregation. Their rehearsal times are different based on their needs.

In addition to this invitation, it seems it's time to call back the kiddos and teens. I have begun contacting and working with teens I know who would like to



lead music at liturgy. If there are other teens who would like to join in the song, please just ask. We have room and consider the more the merrier.

Children's choir will begin in October. More details will be

forthcoming, but if your kiddos are interested please let Brad know via the office or email at lietoba@gmail.com or 248-626-0840. Depending on interest and availability, it looks like rehearsals will be either on Monday next to a religious ed time or Wednesday before the big kids. Again, more details will be forthcoming as we compile a list of interested kids.

Finally, we are continuing to grow our orchestra program. We will begin rehearsing "con brio" on Sundays from 1:30 – 3 in the church. If anyone is interested (ordinarily middle-school aged or older) who play violins, violas cellos or basses, please have them contact me as well. This year we will be joined by some of my students from the Mercy High School Orchestra where I've been pinch hitting over the last few months as well as the pros who sit in as section leaders. We will be playing once a month at masses.

And now, having said all of that, I'm ready for a nap! Lol! So very much to be excited to be making music with you. I'm working on more events, but at the moment have to get the ship moving in the right direction.

In the meantime, I wanted to say. If you're feeling ready and safe (and perhaps vaccinated) you are welcome to join in singing. We have been working on some new technology that should help us create song easier and that will be arriving in the next few months (I hope). More on that later, but for now, as long as you're feeling safe, you are welcome to begin singing along.
