
A POLISH TRADITION:

The Christmas Eve meal starts with a prayer, the sharing of the blessed **oplatek** (a bread wafer) and exchanging wishes. Each person gathered offers good health and success in the upcoming year to one another.

You may consider participating in this ritual of millenniums past so you too may carry it forward.






ADULT SPIRITUALITY



Scripture Study resumes this week, Wednesday December 15th at 9:30 AM in the Parish Center. All are welcome! We are using a lectionary-based program that allows us to study and prepare for the up-coming Sunday liturgy. We will be taking a deep dive into the gospel of Luke this year as our conversation and faith sharing becomes more engaging. This will be our last meeting before the Christmas break.



Mark your calendar for our next Women's Spirituality gathering which will be held on Thursday, January 6 from 10 – 11:30 AM in the Parish Center. We will explore the history and practice of Spiritual Direction and discuss how it can be a tool for deepening our faith.



Curious about Pope Francis' call for a **Synodal Church**? There has been a lot of discussion about this new initiative that was launched this past month. Officially the process is called a synod, which literally means walking together or dreaming together. The church has always had "synods," even if they weren't called by that name. The first synodal process is recorded in Acts of the Apostles, which is the story of how the church first learned to walk and dream together. Following the Second Vatican Council, Pope Paul VI revised and formalized the synodal process for the modern era. His goal was to continue the spirit of Vatican II by occasionally gathering representative bishops from around the world to consult with him on important matters.

Pope Francis has taken Pope Paul's reform one step—one *giant* step—further. Instead of consulting with just the bishops, Pope Francis is consulting with the entire church. And when he says "church," he doesn't just mean people who go to church. The official handbook for the synod says:

For this reason, while all the baptized are specifically called to take part in the Synodal Process, no one—no matter their religious affiliation—should be excluded from sharing their perspective and experiences, insofar as they want to help the Church on her synodal journey of seeking what is good and true. This is especially true of those who are most vulnerable or marginalized. (Synod Official Handbook)

We are excited to announce that we will be hosting several opportunities for the St. Owen community to participate in the Synod process that Pope Francis has initiated. Dates and times of our gatherings will be announced soon. We will have gatherings to meet everyone's needs – morning, afternoon, evening and even a few remote opportunities for those who prefer to not gather in person.

Stay tuned! Please pray for Pope Francis and for this wonderful opportunity for our church.

On December 1, we presented our second virtual (18th annual) Advent by Candlelight, supporting our Sharing With a Family Christmas program. This year Sister Janet Schaeffler (OP) Dominican Order, Director for Adult Faith Formation for the Archdiocese of Detroit, spoke on “Advent—What Are We Really Waiting For?”

Sister Janet provided a slide presentation exploring the many ways in which God is actually waiting for us to be who we are, and that we are called to act with compassion. Sister spoke of how ‘God created us to wonderment’, and He waits for us to notice Him in unexpected places and in unexpected ways. Sister cited St. Augustine, “Receive what you are. Become what you receive.” She asked us to reflect on how we give the gift of ourselves to others. Who are we being sent to help out, either in person, a phone call or a kind note? Can we bring peace to someone around us who is grieving, ill or discouraged? Could we simply show gratitude to someone by saying ‘thank you’? As we are the body of Christ, we should watch for God’s presence in unexpected places and people, and bring joy to someone who is discouraged or in need of a warm smile.
