
# A NOTE FROM FATHER MIKE

Throughout his pontificate (since 2013) Pope Francis has often challenged us in the church to begin our missionary discipleship by looking to the peripheries. This fourth week of Advent offers great scriptural examples of how God models that same mandate; whether it is in the prophet Micah trying to get his message out or Elizabeth and Mary trying to come to grips with why God would choose them for a discipleship that no one would believe.

Readying ourselves to welcome Christ is not an annual celebration but a daily challenge. A couple of weeks ago I attended a board meeting for the Malta Dental and Health clinic located on Woodward in midtown Detroit. This clinic is the epitome of dealing with folks on the periphery; of the 600 served this year 99.21% of the clients are without health insurance, and 42 of the walk ins were homeless. I was so proud of the 8 physicians who donate their time to caring for the poorest of the poor and the medical and dental students who are serving the clinic for their hands on experience. If you are looking for a worthy cause for your end of the year giving why not look at the Malta Dental and Health Clinic and join in the outreach to those on the periphery? (maltaclinic.org)

# YOUTH GROUP



December's Meeting focused on the magi. Not Balthasar, Melchior, and Gaspar who brought **gold**, **frankincense**, **and myrrh** to the baby Jesus but, rather the short story titled *The Gift of the Magi* by O. Henry. The characters, a married couple, Jim and Della, make a great sacrifice and sell their most cherished possessions in order to purchase a Christmas gift for each other. Della sells her long hair to buy Jim a watch chain for his prized pocket watch while Jim sells the watch to buy Della hair combs.

After listening to the story, the teens discussed the lessons found within the story? One of the lessons clearly obvious of "The Gift of the Magi" is that we often don't value what we truly should. Jim loves Della, and he doesn't need a fancy watch chain for Christmas to make him happy--he already has a wife he adores. Another point discussed is that happiness does not depend on money, but on love.

The true gift in the story is the sacrifice that Jim and Della are each willing to make for one another in order to purchase a gift worthy and beautiful enough to be owned by the other.

This sacrifice illustrates their love and generosity they have for each other. They may have been foolish to think they needed to sell their possessions, but wise in expressing their love.

The teens' nametags also symbolized something that evening. They were each given a 'gift name tag,' symbolizing each teen is a gift, with unique gifts and talents. A gift from God, a gift to give to each other and to encourage each other to share their gifts. We prayed that they remember their unique gifts and to share them not only this month but throughout the year and to always show their light & be the link to spread truth and peace.

Our **Sharing with a Family** program that was fully sponsored by parishioners provided for 192 individuals from 47 families with gift cards for each family member and gift cards for a Christmas

dinner, along with some extra surprises. Our **Promise Tree** program supporting St. Rose's Seniors, Freedom House and Pope Francis Center was a sight to behold. In addition to your generosity, our remarkable knitting ministry donated 12 lap blankets and 2 shawls that crocheted to 14 lucky seniors of St. Rose. Each stitch is a stitch of love!!!! An additional 16 blankets were purchased with donations for the remaining seniors; for many this may be the only gift they receive this Christmas. Close to 200 gifts were distributed from the **Promise Tree** and another several hundred items were collected for the Pope Francis Center to support their filling of 200 backpacks for the homeless men of Detroit. Items collected included long underwear sets, warm socks & cotton socks, fleece blankets (to serve as another barrier to the cold), hats, scarves, and warm winter gloves. Thank you, dear friends of St. Owen, every gift, every donation has a huge impact on those less fortunate each gift bringing them a ray of hope and the sense the others care for them.



Thank you, Liz Stanley, Gerri Lampertius and Barb Forte, co-chairs of the Promise Tree. All 200 gifts from the agencies sponsored were received by the representative. The agencies include **St. Rose Senior Center** (serving low-income

seniors), **Freedom House** (temporary home for refugees and asylum seekers), **Pope Francis Center** (provides vital services to the city's homeless). Thank you, Liz, Gerri and Barb, for all your work to coordinate and fulfill these requests and make Christmas a little brighter for these gift recipients in need!
