- All overnight trips require a deposit. You will need to find your own roommate for overnight trips.
- All trips depart from the Target parking lot in Hartland.
- The first price listed is the HSAC member fee, the second fee is for non-members.
- Reservations are booked at a 'group rate' and typically require a minimum number of tickets sold.

Refund Policy

- If you need to cancel your trip, there will be no refunds issued.
- If the senior center must cancel a trip due to low interest, you will receive a full refund.
