

"The Two Became One," Mark 10:8. If you are interested in beginning marriage preparation, please contact the parish office to schedule a meeting with Fr. Jim.





Seniors experienced this course offered through the Tri-County Office on Aging, which focused on becoming aware of controlling your environment to avoid

falling. Each of the eight, two-hour sessions began with exercises to keep us "young". Why exercises? The classes focused on physical fitness to prevent falls, the <u>need</u> to be assertive in preventing falls, addressing the negative thinking and fears about falling, identifying fall hazards in our homes, and our personal fall-ty habits. Plus a special unit on "get up" practices/techniques after one falls.

All-in-all a power packed week of information and hands-on practice. Now we are ready to "not fall".

Is Recycling Worthwhile? Absolutely!

For years we recycled because we were told protecting the earth, seas, groundwater, and air was the right thing to do. Then, recycling took a hit as it was learned that a lot of what we thought we were recycling into domestic products were simply bundled into large bales and shipped to developing countries with a shortage of natural resources.

But then, something changed. The countries importing our trash, found that they were importing massive environmental problems by way of water and air pollution and, even disease. Hence, we lost the ability to export our trash to other countries.

Many environmentalists and scientists agree this may be one of the best things to happen to us. Now many companies have developed more efficient ways to recycle materials and market the recycled materials for use in mainstream manufacturing. However, everything comes with a cost, and some cities and private trash disposal companies have found it necessary to charge for recycling.

Luckily, in our area, we have not had to face increased costs for recycling. But, if we want to continue to be so fortunate, there are a number of things we can do to improve upon our recycling. Here are some useful tips.

- 1) Do not recycle plastic bags and plastic straws if you use street side recycling, as they can jam up conveyor lines at recycling plants.
- 2) Rinse items off before recycling them, With really gooey containers like mayonaise, salad dressings, yogurt, mustard, and ketchup you might want to wash them with your dishes in the dishwasher. Forget about greasy pizza boxes, they cannot be recycled and can contaminate other cardboard if recycled.
- 3) The best way to recycle is to separate items such as glass, aluminum, cardboard, paper, plastics and take them to a recycle center such as in Grand Ledge, MSU, Delta, Charlotte, etc.
- 4) When shopping, think about how a product is packaged. How much is wasted cardboard or plastic, and is it in a package that can be recycled? Perhaps visit a farm market and bring your own reusable bags.
